The Reality of Sin and Trust in God's Mercy

Beloved Sisters and Brothers,

In our daily lives, we often grapple with the concept of sin, a reality that can feel heavy and overwhelming. Sin, in its various forms, disrupts our relationships, both with ourselves and with others, leading to feelings of guilt, shame, and isolation. Yet, intertwined with this reality is the profound promise of God's mercy, a beacon of hope that invites us to trust in something greater than our failings.

In a world that often emphasizes perfection, people's stories of failure and redemption, nay, our own stories, serve as poignant reminders that our struggles with sin can lead us closer to understanding God's boundless mercy. By opening our hearts to this truth, we can transform our lives and the lives of those around us, fostering an environment where grace prevails over guilt, and hope triumphs over despair.

As a Catholic priest, my vocation as a minister of penance and reconciliation allows me to witness the complex reality of sin in a world that often seems to have lost its sense of moral clarity. In the confessional,

I encounter individuals from all walks of life who grapple with their failings, often feeling isolated and burdened by guilt. This experience highlights a profound truth: while society may downplay sin, the human heart inherently recognizes its weight.



In my ministry, I often see the effects of a culture that emphasizes personal freedom and selffulfillment. Many approach life with the belief that they can define their own moral compass, leading to decisions that ultimately distance them from peace and joy. I've heard confessions where individuals express a profound sense of emptiness, despite their attempts to live authentically. They share stories of choices made in pursuit of pleasure or success, only to find themselves grappling with feelings of regret and disconnection from

God and others. It is in these moments that the reality of sin becomes painfully clear—not just as a violation of divine law, but as a rupture in relationships and a barrier to true happiness.

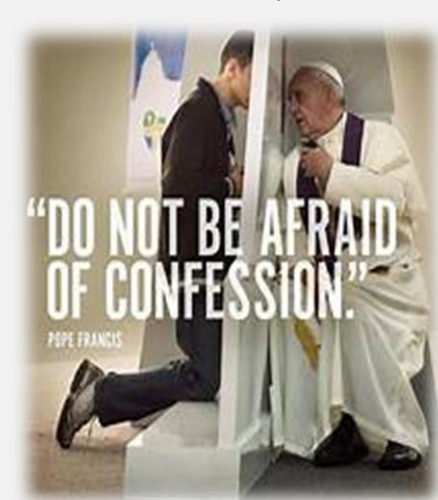
I frequently reflect on the sacrament of reconciliation, where the very act of confessing sins becomes a powerful encounter with God's mercy. It is a sacred space where individuals confront their shortcomings and seek healing. I have seen how the acknowledgment of sin can lead to transformative moments of grace.



For many, the act of confessing—of naming their sins—becomes a liberating experience, a step toward reclaiming their dignity as beloved children of God. In a world that often promotes the idea of self-sufficiency, the sacrament reminds us that we are not alone in our struggles; we are part of a community that supports and uplifts one another.

Yet, it is disheartening to witness how many people have internalized the narrative that sin is irrelevant or that moral absolutes are merely suggestions! This perspective can lead to a numbing of the conscience, where individuals become desensitized to the harm their actions may cause to themselves and others.

Thus, I strive to guide the penitents in understanding that sin is not merely about rules but about love—love for God, for others, and for oneself. When we fail to love, we fall into sin, which ultimately leads to suffering.



In my role, I emphasize the importance of cultivating a well-formed conscience, one that is rooted in the teachings of Christ and the Church. I encourage individuals to engage in regular self-examination, to reflect on their actions and the impact they have on their lives and the lives of others. I believe that Mindfulness in all aspects of life can lead to profound positive changes on one's life. This practice fosters a deeper awareness of sin and its consequences, enabling us to seek reconciliation and healing more authentically.

In my ministry as a priest, I have come to understand that the crux of our journey through sin and reconciliation lies in the profound trust we place in God's mercy. This trust is not merely a passive acceptance but an active acknowledgment that God's love for each of us is infinitely

greater than our greatest failings.

Each time I sit with a penitent in the confessional, I am reminded of the boundless nature of God's compassion. No sin is too great to fall beyond the reach of His mercy; no failure is insurmountable in the light of His love. When individuals come to terms with their shortcomings, they often feel overwhelmed by shame or despair. Yet, it is in these moments of vulnerability that we must remember the truth of the Gospel: God's love is relentless and unconditional. I'm never tired of reminding the penitents, "God's love for you is bigger than your biggest sin!"

The ministry of penance and reconciliation can indeed be exhausting. Hearing the confessions of individuals can sometimes feel tiring, burdensome, and even draining. There are moments when it may seem monotonous, as the weight of others' struggles can bleed one dry. Yet, I can sincerely affirm that it is one of the most fulfilling aspects of a priest's vocation.

The experience of witnessing even a single penitent come to terms with their sin and open their heart to receive the Lord's pardon and peace brings profound joy. In that moment, the exhaustion fades away, replaced by a deep and abiding joy in my heart. The transformative power of God's mercy, experienced through the act of confession, is truly a gift. It reaffirms the beauty of this ministry and reminds me of the incredible privilege it is to accompany others on their journey towards reconciliation with God and experiencing the power of His Mercy.

During this month, to meditate on Mary's sorrows and how she serves as a model of steadfast faith, compassion, and grace in the face of suffering, we will be having online Novena.

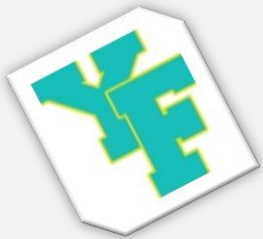

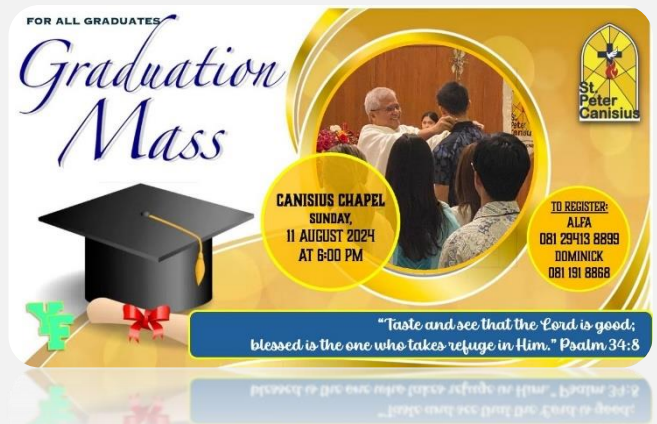
"Taste and see that the Lord is good; blessed is the one who takes refuge in Him." — Psalm 34:8

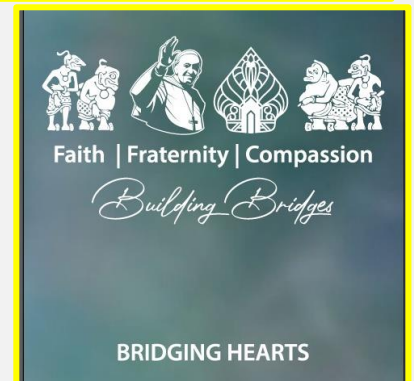
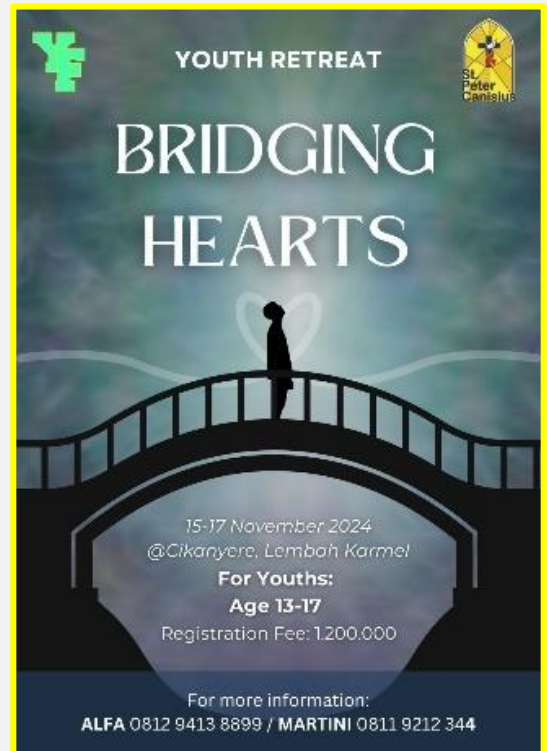

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion



Annual Workshop for the Ministry of EMHC's

On August 3 and 10, 2024, the St. Peter Canisius International Catholic Parish in Jakarta hosted its annual workshop for the Extraordinary Ministry of the Holy Communion, welcoming both current and prospective Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC), including participants from St. Theresia Parish, Blok Q Parish and the Liturgical Commission of the Archdiocese of Jakarta. The event concluded with a solemn installation ceremony, presided over by Father Benedict Bambang Triatmoko S.J., Parish Priest of St. Peter Canisius, who officially inducted 15 new and continuing EMHC members.



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In his introductory remarks, Father Moko emphasized the profound significance of the Eucharist, central to our faith as both sacrifice and divine presence. He highlighted that Jesus' command to partake of His flesh and blood underscores its pivotal role in our spiritual journey. The Eucharist guides us through the **Via Purgativa**, directing us towards purification; the **Via Illuminativa**, illuminating our understanding of life's transcendence; and the **Via Unitiva**, leading us to unity with the Divine and our call to holiness. Rudolph Otto's concept of the Numinous Experience, as detailed in "Be Holy," captures the dual aspects of our sacred encounter: the Tremor, an awe-inspiring fear of Holiness, and the Fascinating, a captivating encounter with the Creator. Despite our imperfections and the fear of our sins, the Eucharist remains a beacon of redemption and divine unity.

Humility remains the cornerstone of our EMHC ministry, crucial for truly understanding our role in serving the Lord and His people. It involves not diminishing ourselves but reducing self-focus and acknowledging our dependence on God. As Extraordinary Ministers of the Holy Communion, we are entrusted with the sacred responsibility of distributing the Body of Christ with reverence and humility. This requires attentiveness, respect, and genuine care for those we serve. Despite the challenges and a world often valuing pride, our mission is to reflect humility in our service, glorify God, and convey His love, rather than seeking personal recognition.

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CCD TEACHERS TRAINING

STPCICP CCD organizes workshops for our teachers and coordinators throughout the CCD year. On August 24, 2024, we held our second workshop, led by our beloved Assistant Parish Priest, Fr. Thomas. With around 18 participants, including dedicated teachers and coordinators, Fr. Thomas delivered an insightful session focused on the Beatitudes, exploring how teachers can convey the Beatitudes to students, enriching their spiritual journey.



We will continue to organise workshops to support our teachers and volunteers in deepening our faith and understanding of catechism and call to serve our CCD community and students.

One of our participants, Pak Yohanes, long-time Confirmation teacher with Mentari CCD Group, shared his reflection on the workshop:

We have an invitation to a life of happiness from Jesus Christ. The Beatitudes (Matthew 5:3-12) taught by Jesus are an invitation to live a blessed and joyful life. Everyone desires happiness and strives to avoid suffering as much as possible. Jesus offers a very compelling invitation to reflect on, one that calls us to surrender ourselves more fully to God. This workshop inspired me to see that the Beatitudes are not something that must be done, a requirement, or a direct command, but rather an invitation from God to humanity—who possess intellect, free will, and conscience—to respond freely. I realize that in the communion life of the Church, God calls each of His people personally to live according to His will. Additionally, I also realize that true happiness does not come from avoiding all suffering, sadness, or harsh realities but from accepting all facts in life and embracing them in faith. It is not easy to immediately agree to the Beatitudes, but with the help of the Holy Spirit and an open heart, Jesus calls us to achieve this true happiness. Let us delve deeper into God's offer of happiness while asking for His grace to always enlighten our hearts and minds. God bless us.



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POPE FRANCIS IN INDONESIA

Apostolic Journey of His Holiness Pope Francis to Indonesia - Actions Spoke Louder Than Words

The long-awaited visit of Pope Francis to Indonesia, previously postponed due to the pandemic, was a moment of profound significance for the Indonesian people. Many wondered what the Pope would bring to this vast and diverse nation. To everyone's surprise, from the moment his journey began, he demonstrated a remarkable simplicity and humility that touched the hearts of millions.

Rather than being remembered for the grand ceremonies typical of state visits, Pope Francis' visit left an indelible mark on the people of Indonesia by the way he embodied compassion, humility, and love. Despite Indonesia's Catholic population being less than 3% of the 280 million citizens, with over 242 million Muslims, the streets were filled with people of all faiths and backgrounds, eagerly greeting the Pope as he passed by.

True to his spirit of simplicity, Pope Francis declined the use of a bulletproof popemobile or luxury vehicles. Instead, he opted for a modest Toyota Innova, traveling with the car windows open to greet the crowds. He even sat in the front seat next to the driver, often asking him to slow down so he could wave and bless the people on the streets. Despite the scorching heat, the Holy Father remained unbothered, always mindful of making personal connections with the people he came to see.

The Indonesian public noticed the Pope's modest Casio watch and well-worn black shoes—signs of his humble lifestyle. Even his accommodations reflected this, as he chose to stay at the Vatican Embassy rather than in a luxury hotel.

For many who saw him or had the privilege of meeting him, the encounter was deeply emotional, with some parishioners describing moments of overwhelming grace and joy. His actions spoke louder than any words could, and they inspired a deep sense of reverence and connection.

On September 5, 2024, Pope Francis celebrated a historic Mass at the Gelora Bung Karno (GBK) Stadium in Jakarta, drawing almost hundred thousand of Catholics from across Indonesia, from Sumatra to Papua. Many travelled long distances just to meet the Holy Father. The Mass was a powerful symbol of inclusiveness and diversity, with the first reading being read by a blind lector, and Indonesian culture showcased throughout the celebration. This special Mass, filled with unity and the spirit of the Gospel, was a profound moment of spiritual renewal for the nation's Catholic community. During his homily, Pope Francis said, **“Listening to the Word and living the Word” are “two fundamental attitudes that enable us to become Jesus’ disciples”**. Reflecting on the Gospel reading for the feast of St. Teresa of Calcutta, the Holy Father noted that **“the human heart is always searching for a truth that can feed its desire for happiness.”** That truth, he said, cannot be found in merely human words, but only in the Word of God, **“the only true compass for our journey, which alone is capable of leading us back to the true meaning of life amid so much woundedness and confusion.”** At the end of his homily, he stressed on **“Always dare to dream of fraternity!”** he continued, encouraging them **“to sow seeds of love, confidently tread the path of dialogue, continue to show your goodness and kindness with your characteristic smile.”**

Our Parish, STPCICP was blessed to have many parishioners as part of the choir, liturgical service, ushers, volunteers and some of our altar servers who served as altar servers at the Holy Mass.



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At the conclusion of his Mass for the faithful, Pope Francis expressed his heartfelt thanks, saying, ***"My visit among you is drawing to an end, and I wish to express my joyful gratitude for the superb welcome that I have received."*** He extended his gratitude to the President of the Republic, civil authorities, and security services, and added, ***"I likewise express my appreciation to the entire Indonesian people."***

In line with the motto of his visit—***Faith, Fraternity, Compassion***—Pope Francis showed us the beauty of a simple, faithful, and compassionate life. His visit has undoubtedly deepened the bond between the Catholic Church and Indonesia, and we pray that it will inspire many to draw closer to Christ.

We are especially grateful to the Holy Father for dedicating four days to our country before continuing his apostolic journey across Asia to Papua New Guinea, Timor-Leste, and Singapore—the longest such visit of his papacy thus far. As a parish, we pray for his health and success as he continues to spread the message of love, peace, and fraternity.

May Pope Francis' visit to Indonesia leave a lasting legacy of faith, compassion, and unity for years to come.

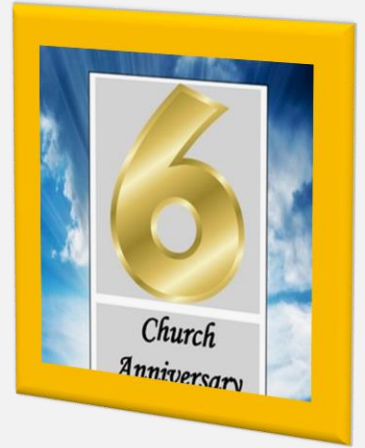

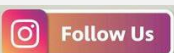

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Triduum to St. Maximilian Kolbe

St. Maximilian Kolbe was a Polish Franciscan friar and martyr, renowned for his deep devotion to the Virgin Mary and his heroic act of self-sacrifice during World War II. In 1941, while imprisoned in Auschwitz, he volunteered to take the place of a fellow prisoner who had been condemned to death. This act of ultimate love and courage led to his death by lethal injection.

Before his martyrdom, St. Maximilian founded the Militia Immaculatae, a movement dedicated to spreading devotion to Mary and the message of the Gospel through modern media. He also established monasteries and publishing houses, aiming to evangelize as widely as possible.

Maximilian Kolbe is a beautiful example of Christ's own sacrificial love. May we always strive to follow in Christ's footsteps like he did. St Maximilian Kolbe, pray for us!

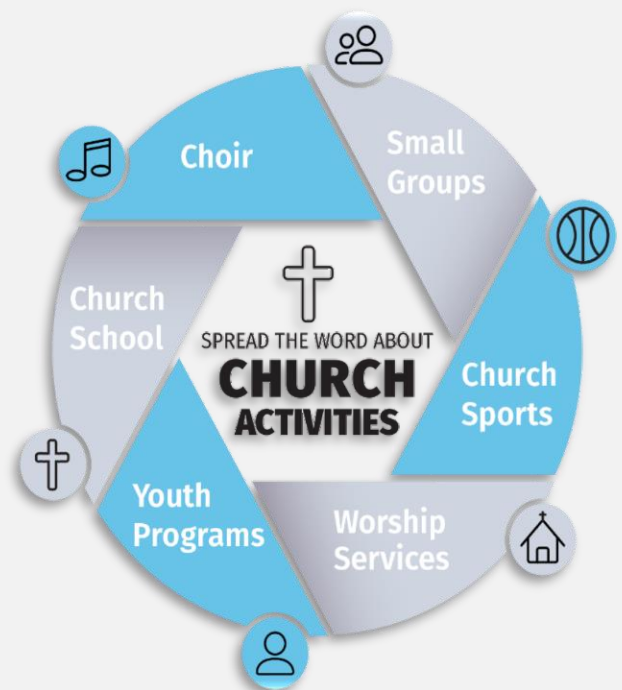


