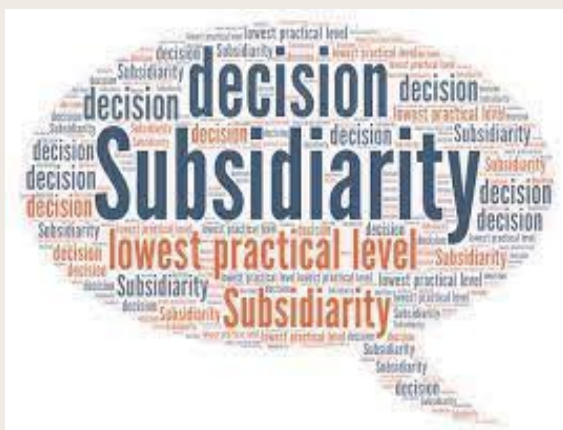

PRACTICAL IMPLICATIONS OF SUBSIDIARITY

“Subsidiarity respects personal dignity by recognizing in the person a subject who is always capable of giving something to others.” - (Pope Benedict XVI, Caritas in Veritate)

Beloved Sisters and Brothers,

Who should have the greatest authority over, and responsibility for, the raising of children? I am sure many of you, if not all, would answer, “Their parents.” How about society and the government? Can they tell parents, or even force them, to raise their children in a certain way? Parents may strongly reject such intervention. We consider it normal and commonsensical that parents have full authority and responsibility for the task. They may take advice from experts about the best method to do so, but it is always optional. When we subscribe to the idea that parents, instead of the state or society, should be the primary educators for their children, we have applied, unknowingly perhaps, the principle of subsidiarity to everyday life arrangements.



The principle of subsidiarity, according to the Catholic social teaching, dictates that the right level for each task is the lowest possible level. Why use the lowest possible level? Because it ensures the highest participation of people in the performance of the task. The concept of human dignity, from which the principle of subsidiarity is derived, demands the maximum

participation of people in finding solutions to their own problems and

thus more effectively fulfill their responsibilities. In addition, it seeks for the maximization of human initiative through all kinds of associations and organizations that can help contribute to the common good. These conditions stem from the conviction that social health can only be attained through the involvement of all parties, from the family on up. The encyclical Quadragesimo Anno (1931) puts it this way: **“Just as**

it is gravely wrong to take from individuals what they can accomplish by their own initiative and industry and give it to the community, so also it is an injustice and at the same time a grave evil and disturbance of right order to assign to a greater and higher association what lesser and subordinate organizations can do. For every social activity ought of its very nature to furnish help to the members of the body social, and never destroy and absorb them.” The principle of subsidiarity thus requires that the involvement of higher levels of government be minimized or restricted to serious problems that cannot be solved by other means.

The applications of subsidiarity can be found in various aspects of moral life. In social ethics, for example, this principle can help assess the decision-making process and navigate the allocation of resources by the government or higher levels of society to support initiatives and engagement by the lower levels. Here the higher levels offer their help and support (subsidiary) to those lower levels of organization concerning the ability to perform the duties. This support is part of the responsibilities of the government to create the necessary conditions for human flourishing as well as protect and promote a multi-layered civil society. Then, let the people themselves take care of the duties responsibly. Certain situations may demand, however, that the State perform necessary obligations, for example, stimulating the economy when civil society is unable to support initiatives on its own. Others may require the intervention of the State for the restoration of greater equality, justice, and peace. The principle of subsidiarity dictates, however, that this involvement of the higher levels must cease when it is no longer necessary since its justification is found only in the exceptional nature of the situation. As an effort at balancing the many necessary levels of society for the common good, subsidiarity emphatically encourages a people-centered approach that allows for their best interests, values, and circumstances to guide the decision-making process.



In medical ethics, the principle of subsidiarity can help guide decision-making regarding the care of patients. It promotes the idea that healthcare decisions must be made with consultation and collaboration with patients by considering their values, preferences, and individual circumstances. Healthcare professionals should function as facilitators, providing information, guidance, and assistance, while fully respecting the autonomy and decision-making capabilities of the patients. As in other fields, the best decisions in the medical world are made at the level closest to the people involved, namely, patients. This can lead to more personalized and effective healthcare. Together with the principle of solidarity, subsidiarity can guide our efforts to uphold the dignity of every individual human person that the common good envisions.

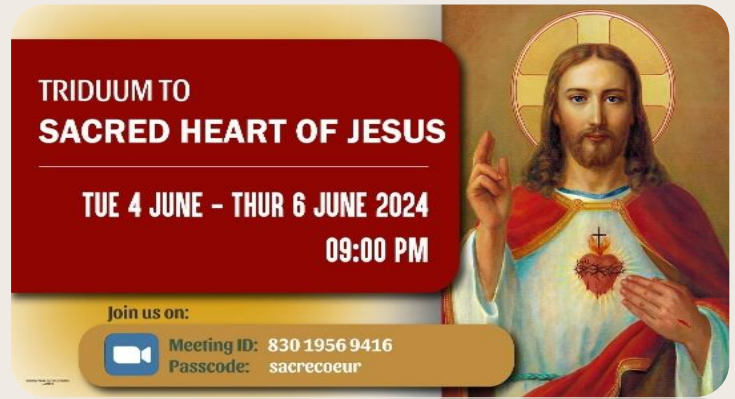

Family Apostolic Ministry (FAM)



“ A Sacred Journey to Lifelong Love – Marriage Preparation Course (MPC)”

Approaching an end of the half year 2024, we had conducted two batches of Marriage Preparation Course (MPC) in February and May. The course was done online in 4 days of 2 weekends attended by 19 and 16 couples respectively from various nationalities. As we know, MPC is a program to help couples who will get married in the Catholic Church to prepare their marriage life for them to journey the ups and downs with love in reaching wholeness in their life.

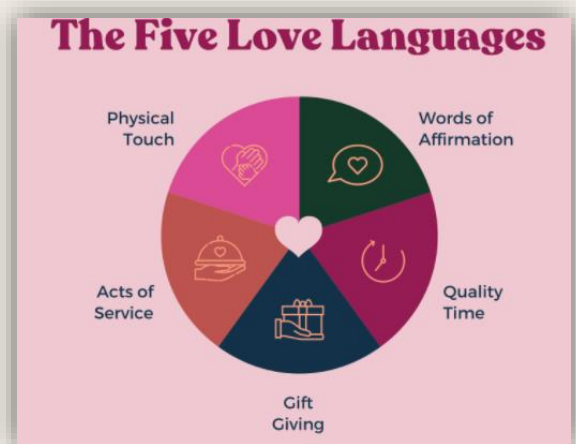
Since 2022, the MPC has been coordinated by the Family Apostolic Ministry (FAM) with trainers and facilitators consisted Fr Moko (Parish Priest), Fr Thomas (Assistant to Parish Priest) and married couples who have been trained and have compassionate to help young couples in preparing their marriage life. By today, FAM has delivered 9 batches of MPC for a total of around 110 couples.

With many couples spread out in different locations, our online MPC has enabled participants to attend without the need to fly to Jakarta. While the online forum successfully brings participants and trainers together virtually, we have implemented rules such as being on time, having cameras on, sitting properly, and participating from an appropriate room to maintain the feel of an in-person class.

Feedback from evaluation forms submitted by participants after each session has allowed us at FAM to maintain and continuously improve both the quality of the MPC and our methods of conducting it.

The delivery of each module is accompanied by real life examples from the facilitator, the married couples, who teach or facilitate the session that is mostly thanked by the participants. The knowing of the love language of the partner and communicating in the partner's love language to make the partner feels loved is praised by the participants. The communication by using i-message instead of you-message open the view of participants on how to communicate one-self concern without blaming, judging or hurting his/her partner. The breakout session for man and woman roles that split men and women in different room to express each person view on the expected role of her to be husband and his to be wife is favored for each could learn and extend view by learning from others. The most loved module is the Marriage Expectation Inventory, a one on one session, in which each couple has a private breakout room with a facilitator to communicate each other expectation in marriage. The couple discuss about 100 items of expectation and will deep dive in dialogue to seek midway if there are differences. The facilitator is helping to ensure each has equal voice and is respected.

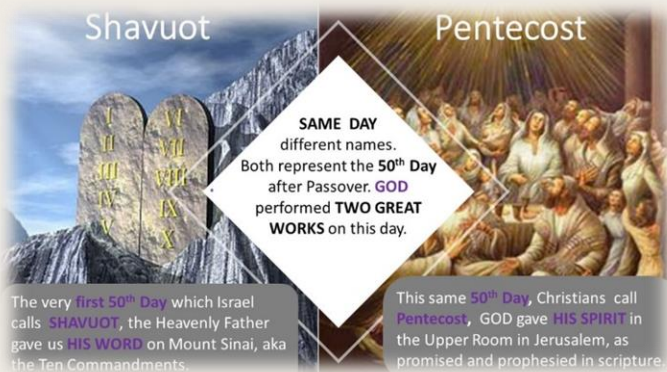


Pentecostal Roots

For our second edition of Young Adult Professional monthly talk on second Saturdays, we had the privilege of having Frater Wishal once again; this time to share with us the origins of Pentecost tradition, the descent of Holy Spirit and what it means for us.

To start off, he highlighted the deep connections between Catholic tradition and Jewish tradition, and reminded us that Jesus himself was born into a Jewish family. Thus, it is important for us to understand that Pentecost tradition mirrored a festive occasion in the Old Testament. He also emphasized that Jesus came to the world not to abolish the Law of Moses in Old Testament, but to fulfill it, including all the Jewish traditions that shaped his life.

“Shavu’ot”, a day of ‘joy’ to celebrate the harvest God has given the people, known as Harvest Feast (Exod 23:16, 34:22) and Day of First fruits (Num 28:26) in the Old Testament, which represents **“spiritual liberation”**. This was fulfilled in the New Testament through Jesus Christ’ ascension to heaven and Pentecost was celebrated as the occasion when Holy Spirit descended on Earth to His apostles and followers, liberating all humans to receive salvation.



In the second part of the talk, Frt. Wishal focuses on the descent of the Holy Spirit and how we can be saved through Him.

After Pentecost, our salvation through Christ relies on repentance and baptism, which are reflected in Catholic Church’s teaching in the sacraments. Through baptism, our body becomes the Temple of God, surrendered to Jesus and guided by the Holy Spirit.

“Kol asher diber Ad-onai na’aseh” means “all that the Lord says we will do”.

As we sang this phrase in Hebrew during the talk, we were reminded to allow Holy Spirit to guide us in our daily lives as we navigate through the world.

The talk was then followed by reflection and sharing in group discussions, particularly about when we have felt Holy Spirit’s presence in our lives. In my group, we shared on how the Holy Spirit has empowered us to do the things we haven’t imagined we were able to do or achieve, and for some of us, we believed that the Holy Spirit has directed us to convert into a Catholic and followed Jesus since then.



This has given us the rare opportunity to look deep inside ourselves and to share our life stories with our fellow parishioners. Thanks also to Frt. Wishal for always making us a little bit more cultured with sharing on biblical history and sprinkles of Hebrew phrases throughout the talk!

We could indeed still feel the after-effect of the talk during Pentecost Sunday mass the week after, having

more context about Pentecost/Shavu'ot and symbolism of the Holy Spirit read during the service, giving the occasion more profound meaning for our spiritual renewal.

The Sacrament of Confirmation: "Empowered by the Spirit, Witnesses to Christ"

The Sacrament of Confirmation is a profound and sacred milestone in the spiritual journey of our parish teenagers. It strengthens their bond with the Church and deepens their commitment to living out their faith. Through the anointing with chrism and the laying on of hands by the bishop, the Holy Spirit bestows upon them the gifts needed to be courageous and active witnesses of Christ. This sacrament completes their initiation into the Catholic Church, empowering them to fully participate in its sacramental life and to serve others with love and dedication. 71 confirmands from our parish were sealed with the holy spirit by **Archbishop Piero Pioppo**, Apostolic Nuncio during the Mass on 11th May 2023. Congratulations to all the confirmands and parents.



A Big thanks to all the CCD teachers, CCD Coordinators, Volunteers and Church staff and to St Theresia Church for their continued support and dedication, here is the reflection penned down by one of the parent:

Reflection - On Saturday, May 11, 71 children from 7 CCD Groups under the auspices of the St. Peter Canisius International Catholic Parish (STPCICP) gathered at St. Theresia Church to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. Among them was my son, Ryan, from Mentari Intercultural School. His sponsor, Margerry, who has been his sponsor since baptism, attended with her daughter Meredith, who was also a confirmation candidate, and her son Kyle who served as one of the Altar Servers.

This event marked the culmination of a year-long effort by the children, with full support from their parents, schools, and the CCD Coordinators of STPCICP. Confirmation is a significant milestone on a Catholic's

spiritual journey. For Ryan, this journey began at baptism, continued through the Sacrament of Penance and First Holy Communion, and now has reached the Sacrament of Confirmation. This Sacrament confirms him as an adult member of the Church, fully aware of the choices he makes, including choosing his own confirmation name of Francis to complement the baptism name Raphael which was given by us, his parents.

The event was joyous and the church was packed. The ceremony was made even more special by the presence of His Excellency Archbishop Piero Pioppo, the Apostolic Nuncio to Indonesia, who officiated the event. As Nuncio, Archbishop Pioppo serves as a the Vatican Ambassador to Indonesia and the point of contact between the Holy See and Indonesia. The candidates entered the church ahead of the Archbishop, and our Parish Priest Fr. Moko, who was the concelebrant. Fr. Moko formally presented each candidate to the Archbishop.

In his homily, the Archbishop warmly welcomed all the candidates as mature members of the community of confirmed Catholics, and reminded them of their roles and responsibilities to society, to spread Jesus' message of love. He also announced the upcoming visit of Pope Francis to Indonesia this September and the festive events that will be held then. For the Confirmation ceremony, the Archbishop anointed each candidate with consecrated oil and placed his hand on their cheek, an old tradition that symbolizes a "slap" to remind the candidates that following the cross of Jesus Christ can result in suffering. The event ended with numerous photos being taken, which was well-coordinated and orderly.

As a parent of three children at Mentari Intercultural School, I would like to express my gratitude to our Parish, especially to the CCD team, coordinators, and religion teachers for their time, effort, and sacrifice in making this happen. I have witnessed their tireless and often thankless efforts in coordinating the many moving parts to ensure these spiritual growth milestones occur in a sacred and significant way. In Matthew 22:14, Jesus said, "many are called, but few are chosen." May the examples set by these volunteers encourage our children to serve in whatever capacity they can.

As we headed home, we picked up the thoughtful commemorative gifts and the Confirmation certificate signed by the Archbishop. Ryan, pointing at the signature proudly, said, "Wait until I show my Koko this."

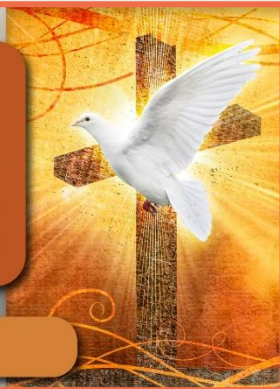

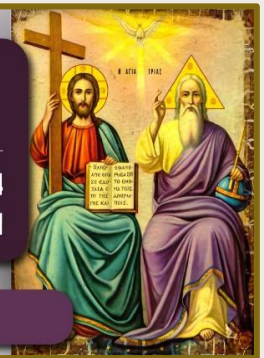

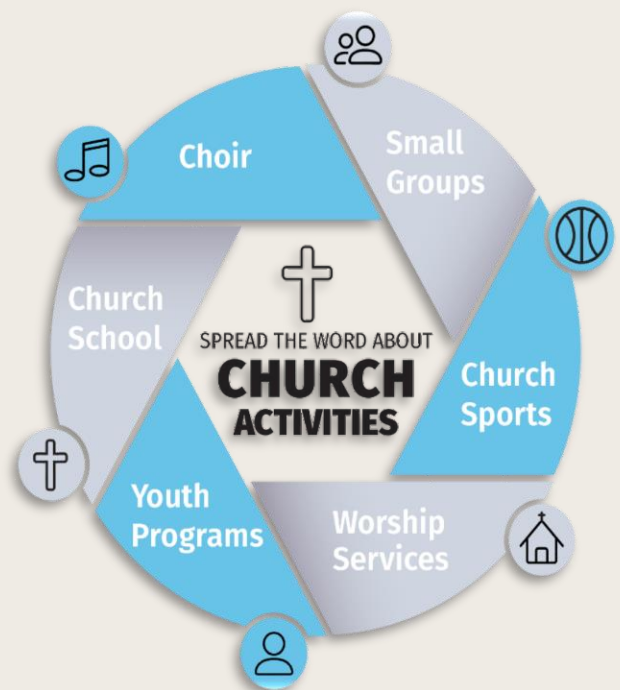
