THE YEAR OF REFLECTION 2021

Beloved Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Our Archbishop Ignatius Cardinal Suharyo has established the year of 2021 as the Year of Reflection in the Archdiocese of Jakarta. The original plan was in 2021 to start a strategic vision mission of the Archdiocese for the period of 2021 – 2025. But the signs of times like the wide spread of Corona pandemic which affected many aspects of our lives, the damaging effects of hoax, hatred speeches, public lies, to the harmony among people in our society, have directed the Archdiocese of Jakarta to engage deeper reflection so that we can move forward with clearer vision.





The foundation and source of our reflection is in the belief that God loves us. That is a clear message announced by the angels to the shepherds at Jesus' birth "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests." (Luke 2:14). The voice from heaven at the baptism of Jesus highlighted that reality: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased" (Luke 3:22).

The same words are addressed to each on of us by God who dwells in the innermost of our hearts. The experience of being loved by God the Father had moved all aspects of Jesus' life and directed Him to carry out the mission given by His Father. We too hope that our fundamental experience as the beloved children of God will move us to faithfully follow Jesus Christ in proclaiming the Kingdom of God. We express our desire to follow Jesus in the Archdiocese of Jakarta through the motto: To Love More; To Get More Involved and To Become More Of Blessing To Others.

Our major questions for our reflection are: What is God's will for us in this time of pandemic Covid 19? And what new things that God expected to emerge from us after the pandemic? To reflect on those questions, Our parish will conduct a parish retreat during the Lenten Season 2021. We will use our Faith Forum session on every Saturday during Lenten Season to invite speakers to help us to reflect on these themes:

- Feb 20, 2021: My Relationship with God
- Feb 27, 2021 : My Relationship with One Another and in the Family
- March 6, 2021: My Relationship with Nature
- March 13, 2021: My Relationship in the Digital Age
- March 20, 2021 : Sharing Session

We have assigned an official committee for the year of Reflection 2021. This committee will help our parish to plan events and implementations in line with other parishes in the Archdiocese.

Besides the Year of Reflection, this year 2021 is also established as the Year of St. Joseph by Pope Francis. Our parish has started the Novena of St Joseph every Wednesday at 9 pm via online. We are all invited to participate. May we all stay united in prayers and actions during this unprecedented time of pandemic and can find God's will for each one of us.




YOUTH FELLOWSHIP CORNER

YF Action Online Session by Patrick Elang Prakarsa

Date: 23 Jan 2021

Topic: "Your True Potential"



For the month of January 2021, YF session's speaker was our own Young adult who had served and participated in YF earlier. Here is a reflection of his session on how to find true potential in you

In the story of the Hunchback of Notre Dame, one's appearance seem to signify whether the individual is considered a monster or a man. Of course, we know this is not true, but nevertheless we may wonder, what is the difference between monster and man? A monster is not one whose physical appearance is 'monster-like', but rather someone with a terrible personality that may even go so far as to do awful things with bad intentions upon others. A man, on the other hand, is someone who has good intentions, good characteristics, and does kind deeds to others.

To achieve our true potential as humans, first we need to make sure we have positive self-value or self-worth. Constant negative bashing will only lead to a lower self-esteem, but vice versa compliments will lead to a positive and higher self- esteem. We need to be aware of this and not be so critical of ourselves because God has made each of us beautiful and perfect in our own ways. He has also given us the most priceless gift of all, our human dignity, and that can never be taken away from us. Furthermore, it is also important for us to remember that the value of our lives does not depend on others nor is it measured in relative to others. To Him, we are all equally as valuable, regardless of how much possessions or talents we may have. The question that begs then, if we are all the same and equal in God's eyes, does this mean all of us have the same potential? The answer is a resounding ves.

Our duty is not only to recognize our talents, but to develop them and use it for God's glory. After all, we will not be measured by how many talents we have, but by how much can we utilize our God-given talents for others. TOPIC: IF YOU CAN ASK JESUS NOW, WHAT WOULD YOU ASK HIM?

Date: 30 January 2021, Speaker: Fr. Benedictus Hari Juliawan, SJ

The Youth fellowship was unique, unlike previous YF sessions, this was made in the form of "Questions and Answers". All CCD groups were asked to submit questions prior to the session and the session mainly focused only on answers. Speaker focused on three main areas and tried answer under the below three categories:

- 1. Will I go to Heaven? No one knows about heaven, but Jesus said that God has a room for everyone in his house. People who know the Lord, call his name, do good things and love one another will go to heaven. You don't need religion to do good things in life. Love motivates us to do better and be a good person. Baptism is not an antidote, but it makes you join a family who do good things for the community and allows you to help those who are suffering. The second coming of Christ will happen but no one knows the exact time. Jesus comes anytime in the sense of Him taking people to heaven. Eternity is outside time. We'll never understand it.
- 2. Sin: Sin is breaking the law. We may not mean what we did, but the consequences are always there. White lies are still sin. How grave it is depending on the motive. Forgiveness is important because it releases us from pain; letting go of our burdens. It also gives another person a second chance, allowing them to grow as a person. It could also mend our relationships and make it stronger. God's forgiveness is always greater than our sins. God has His own idea of justice: unconditional love. We cannot give God anything but our love. We need God's grace to be able to forgive. Fr. Benny advises us not to be afraid of difficulties as it is a part of growing up. On homosexuality: Being practicing gay is sin, but you are not fully

responsible for it because you had no choice as you are born like that. "We need to focus on the person and not on his/her identity". RESPECT is

what matters; be who you are.

3. Destiny

Destiny maybe what God wants and what you want. It depends on hard work. As humans we can influence our future. If we don't study, we might not be successful. We should not blame God for this pandemic. It is humans' fault for being greedy. This isn't a punishment from God. He wants us to spread love to others and get through this together.

09th VIRTUAL FAITH FORUM

Date: 23 Jan 2021, Topic: How to Become Jesus' Witness?

"Joseph, Son of David, do not fear to take Mary your wife, for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit; she will bear a son, and you shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins" (Mt 1:20-21).



As the Holy Scripture does not discuss much about Saint Joseph, the eloquent silence nevertheless provides us with a glimpse of his character, Righteous, Obedient, Pure, Humble, Silent (contemplative), Husband, Protector and guardian of our Savior; Jesus Christ and His mother: the Blessed Virgin Mary. Saint Joseph has experienced similar difficulties in life as we all do, yet he still lived an exemplary life. Saint Joseph possessed an unwavering faith and utmost trust in God's providence. Being a man of faith, rather than listen to the voices of doubt and human pride, Joseph decided to place his trust in Mary and his faith in God. God was first and foremost, above all, in Saint Joseph's life. In other words, he is an upright man of faith and outstanding virtues. Joseph always listened to the voice of God, he was deeply sensitive to His secret will, and he was attentive to the messages that came to him from the depths of his heart and from God. He serves as a wonderful role model for us in our today's unruly culture.

For Saint Joseph, doing God's will was extremely paramount. Saint Joseph never questioned what God told him and carried out God's promptings without hesitation or delay – his response was immediate, and he would carry out the task at hand the way God wanted it done. After the angel appeared to him in a dream, assuring him that Mary's child was conceived through the Holy Spirit, Joseph took Mary into his home as his wife. With an unfailing presence and complete fidelity, Joseph placed himself entirely at the service of Mary and Jesus, taking them into his home and into his heart, protecting them, caring for them and providing for them. As the head of the Holy Family, when Mary and the young Jesus encountered the hardships of everyday life, Joseph stood at their side, providing them with help and encouragement. After the visit of the magi, upon receiving the angel's warning, Joseph wasted no time, immediately getting up and taking his little family and fleeing to Egypt in the middle of the night to escape King Herod's murderous wrath. Later, after Herod's death, the angel again instructed Joseph that it was time to return to the land of Israel, and while he probably intended to return to Bethlehem in Judea, chose rather to go to Nazareth in Galilee upon being warned by the angel that Herod's son ruled Judea in his place. When God told Joseph to get up and go, Joseph unhesitatingly got up and went.

Saint Joseph was a man of action, obeying God's will for him in the ordinary duties of daily life. He did the ordinary things of everyday and ordinary life with love. By following his example, we should be able to discover a considerable peace of mind in knowing we are faithfully doing the ordinary, little things that God wants us to do.

To mark the occasion, the Holy Father has proclaimed a "Year of Saint Joseph" from today, 8 December 2020, to 8 December 2021.




