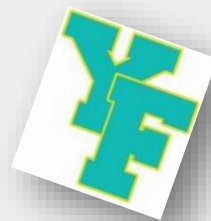

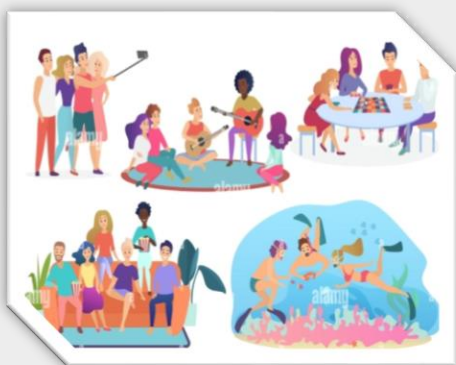

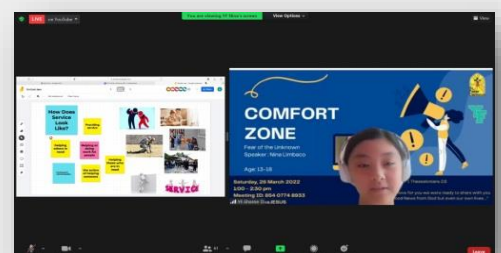
Reflection # 1 - Ryan Osia, YFC

Reflection # 2 – Kelley Sutandinata, ACS CCD Confirmation

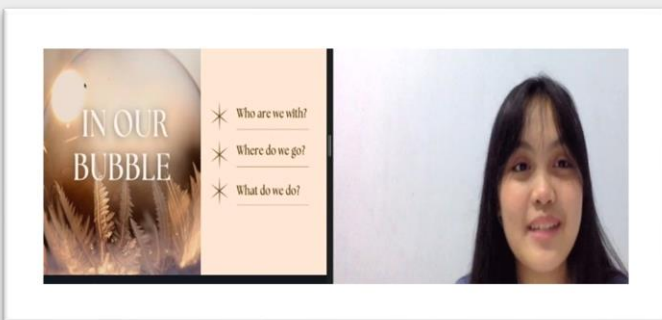
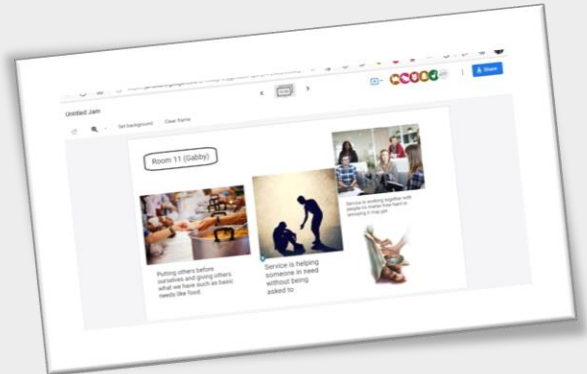
In today's YF session, our topic was comfort zone. We explored the expression "in our bubble" before moving into the breakout

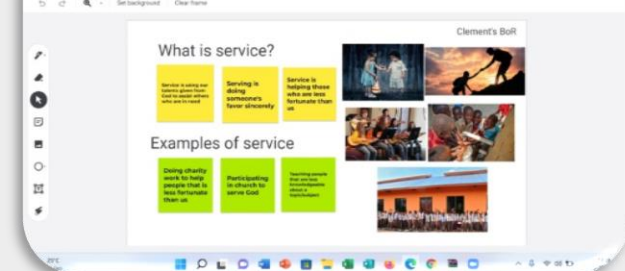

to pursue extraordinary lives, to strive for the unattainable, with heaven as our overall purpose. To achieve greatness, you must first venture beyond your comfort zone; second, you must acknowledge that we serve a limitless God, and thus we must cease putting restrictions on Him. The third stage is to embrace life, trusting that God is in control, and will continuously remain by our side, guiding us. Since releasing this, I've been gradually expanding my horizons and exposing myself to new experiences, as well as being more courageous. I also recognized that I desired a faith that was always striving to grow, one that didn't settle and rest. LENTEN Reflection 2022

Especially in this season of Lent where we are asked to pray, fast, and do almsgiving, how beautiful of an offering if we can refrain from the unhealthy habits and show that the Lord is in our actions, how we can educate not through words but through our better choices and actions.



2. Church's Role in Health

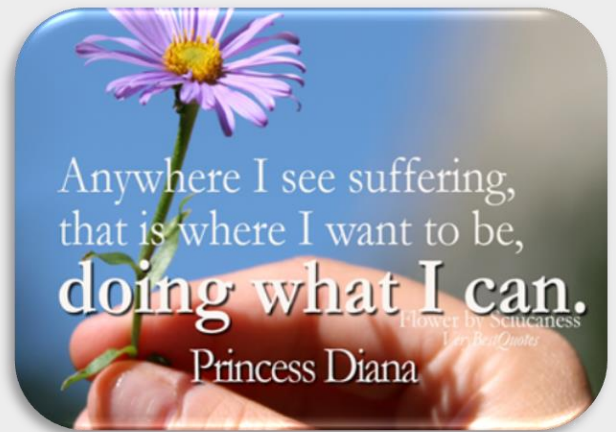


Mark 2: 3-5 "Some men came, bringing to him a paralyzed man, carried by four of them. Since they could not get him to Jesus because of the crowd, they made an opening in the roof above Jesus by digging through it and then lowered the mat the man was lying on." Through this bible verse, Fr. Francis Teo MCSPA reminded us how important it is to go the extent in helping one another. One's care and effort can go a long way and help so much, when met with compassion. We as the Church, can do that with the Lord's compassion.

3. Church's Role in Social Security

Sis. Berenice Gama de Rose reminded us how so often we turn a blind eye and say that the government is the one responsible for the poor, not us, since we've paid taxes. As a member of the Church, we are all called to action, to lend a hand to help the poor in whatever way we can, to have compassion for others,

just Jesus has done and given us many examples, through His compassion. He gave sight to the blind, He helped the couple in Cana, He fed those who were hungry. Where should we start? Look closest around you, the workers at home, your neighbours, your environment. How can we help? By sharing lunch packages, by sharing quotas for the needy school children doing online school, sharing time to teach the street children, by giving 5-star rating to the Gojek and so much more. Mark 14: 7 "The poor you will always have with you, and you can show kindness to them whenever you wish, but you will not always have me."



4. Church Role in Micro Business



As the pandemic hits Indonesia and the rest of the world, many businesses have had to shut down, take early retirement, have lost jobs and taken. Bro. Ivan Abraham reminded us how we are all able to help, not just out of pity but to make sure that the sellers are selling what is needed, in the right way. Help them develop and connect them with those who can help. How? By giving time, attention, and financial advice to micro business owners, on ways to elevate their income through social media and create an outreach program for financial literacy. We can help

micro-business owners to be creative through our positive support and input, learning from past mistakes and correcting them for better outcome.



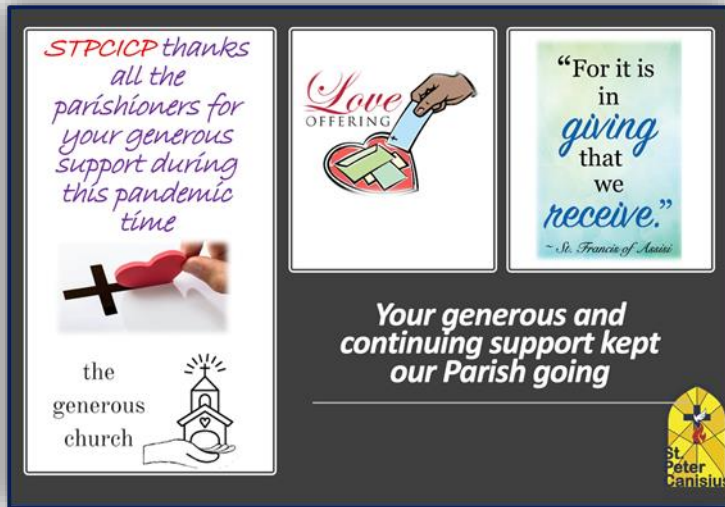


COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES IN MARCH 2022
