THE YEAR OF REFLECTION: TO GET INVOLVED MORE

"Non nobis solum nati sumus ortusque nostri partem patria vindicat, partem amici" ("Not for us alone are we born; our country, our friends, have a share in us") - Marcus Tullius Cicero, De Officiis [On Duties], 1:22)

Beloved Sisters and Brothers,

It is almost a universal trait in various cultures and societies to expect some contributions from their members in attaining their common goal. Such trait stems from the belief that while the role of the leader is important, the active involvement of the members is no less essential to shaping the future of the community. Since the goal is the common good rather than the welfare of certain people, the virtues promoted and inculcated are generally communal such as selflessness, generosity, compassion, and service. Selfish attitude and actions are thus discouraged, if not punished, because they do not serve the large community purposes.



We must admit of our slowness in taking care of the needs of the community. We tend to think first of our own needs and then, perhaps, of those of our society or the larger group we belong to. For this reason, in the Year of Reflection we are invited to examine our personal and communal involvement in the betterment of the Church and our society and to see how we can participate more actively in it. To do so, we need to return to the main vision and mission of these larger communities. Their concerns generally cover the fundamental needs of the various segments in the community and reach out to the marginalized and least advantageous groups. To get involved more, we need to align ourselves with such mission, making sure that it is carried out properly

according to the original intention. Our alignment and participation in the works for the community is a sure sign of our involvement in building a better world to live in.

When Jesus taught the crowds, "Seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given you" (Matthew 6:33), he was inviting them to align themselves with God's concerns and purposes. We remember Jesus's earlier teaching about the futility of worrying about our own needs because of God's loving care for us. By aligning ourselves with God's vision and mission and pursuing only God's interests in the building of God's kingdom, we let God make use of our lives for the realization of this kingdom. This is the highest and most meaningful involvement we can make ourselves available for. Only then can God take care of our daily needs. God



loves and cares not only about certain people or nations, but every single being in the whole existence. As

we learn during this pandemic, no one is safe until everyone is safe. That is the extent of God's love for the whole creation and even beyond. It is true, as Cicero says, that our country and our friends have a share in us and therefore, we must not live only for ourselves. But more than our country and friends, God the Creator has the ultimate share in us. Without God, we are nothing. Yet, God invites us to participate in His mission. Being involved in God's plan and purpose in

creating the whole existence including us is priceless indeed.


Topic: Body Builder - The Role of the

Reflection #1 by Allison Tee - CCD PI Group

I learned from today's YF session, that each of us help to build the Church through our contributions and our faith in God. It is important to take care of ourselves so that we can be better not only for ourselves but for the people that we are surrounded by. Our faith in God is what brings all of us together so that we can all worship him properly.

Reflection #2 by Jeana Sophia Limbaco – YFC

Today's YF and YFC session was led by Elang discussing our topic "Body Builder, The Role of Youths in Catholic Church". Deriving from the passage 1 Corinthians 12: 2-27, "Now you are Christ's body, and individually parts of it." This reading reminds the youth of our purpose in the church. Diverse in people, with different roles, to collectively glorify God and help serve the church. We are members of one church who are accountable and responsible for the church. Elaborating more on the topic in smaller groups, we discussed the current



state of the church., and how we can help the church. Answering questions such as "Are we fulfilling our duties as parts of the Church?", "How has the YF community been doing as our contribution to the church?", and "As individuals how can we contribute to the Church?". As, youths, there are many ways we can

contribute to the Church and community using the gifts and talents that God has given us with. There were also some suggestions to how the church can adapt to our current society.



Diving deeper into the topic, we talked about our self-improvement and growth to strengthen our relationship with God. We can be able to help the church and be a better reflection of Christ. Aspects that we discussed to improve individually include physical, mental, and spiritual health. Self-care and improvement are valuable because our bodies are temples of the Lord, and we should take care of them (1 Corinthians 6:19-20). The talk concluded with a call to action to

participate in more Church activities such as game night, Bible studies, etc.

Reflection #3 by Masan Gunawan – Grade 08, SPH

God created humans with many important parts inside our bodies for it to function well. If our body were made up of a single part, we may not be able to function effectively. Similarly, Brother Elang stated that the Church is also made up of various important parts. All these parts work together as a single cohesive community.



Imagine if someone were to lose his or her arm, will the person still be able to function well in society? Of course! However, the person will need to adapt, and other parts of the body may need to compensate for the lost arm. The same applies in a community setting. To convey God's teachings effectively, the Church cannot do this only through Sunday Mass. It needs the support and contribution from the other parts of the community of believers as well, such as the youth.

As a member of the community, the youth need to contribute their part so that God's blessings may be felt widely. This can be done through activities such as attending mass regularly or by participating in community service to help others. Each of us has been given a part to play in this world. We need to use our talents wisely to make the world a better place.

As with everything else, the Church and we, as members of the community, may need to constantly improve ourselves, so we can serve the community better. Several ideas were suggested by the attendees on how to

make the Church more relatable to the youth, such as women being allowed to become priests* or having more exciting and relatable homilies for the youth.

As for ourselves, Brother Elang reminded us that we need to improve ourselves in three aspects, physically, mentally, and spiritually. Improving our physical self can be done through exercise and eating a balanced diet. After all, our bodies belong to God and should be treated as a temple of God. Mental improvements can be done by going on a social media 'detox' or by taking short breaks to be silent and pray to God.

Furthermore, spiritual improvements can be made by attending faith seminars and surrounding we with a community of believers to grow

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spiritually together. We are all brothers and sisters in Christ, so we should support one another and keep growing in the spiritual journey together towards eternal salvation.




12th Faith Forum

Topic: "The Gift of Eucharist part 2: The Mystery of the Body and Blood of Christ

During the words of the institution spoken by the priest, transubstantiation happens. The reality (what it is)



changes. Ordinary bread and wine changes into the body and blood of Christ. The appearance (what it is like) remains the same, for we see ordinary bread and wine. Ultimately, we believe because Jesus, who is God, says it. We believe in the power of His word. Lest we are tempted to think that we do not get anything out of the Holy Mass, we need to remember this: We receive His word. God Himself speaks to us through the first reading, second reading, responsorial psalm, the Gospel, and the Homily. We receive the body, blood, soul, and divinity of Jesus Christ

in the Holy Communion. How, then, can we say we do not receive anything?

A deeper understanding, however, is needed. A perspective shifts. We do not participate in the Holy

Eucharist to "get" something, we participate to worship God, who is infinitely worthy. The essence of every religion is worship. The essence of worship is sacrifice. In the Eucharist, we offer the sacrifice of Jesus Christ to God the Father, along with the sacrifice of ourselves and our entire lives. Father Noel shared the story of Blessed Alexandrina Da Costa who lived for



13 years from eating the Holy



the words of eternal life" (John 6: 68).

Communion alone. No other food was taken, but the bread of life. Jesus promises that for the one who eats His flesh and drinks my blood (1) eternal life is given, (2) He will raise him up on the last day, (3) He lives in God, and God in him (John 6: 54 - 56). The Greek word that Jesus uses for "eat" when He says, "Whoever eats my flesh" (John 6: 54) is trogon. It means to chew, gnaw (mengunyah, menggigit dengan keras). Jesus means "eat" in a literal sense.

Father Noel explains John 6, Berengarius' false notion of the consecrated host and wine being symbolic, and St. Thomas Aquinas' teachings on the Eucharist (11th - 13th century), the protestant revolt, and the response of the Council of Trent (16th century), and the Encyclical of St. Pope Paul VI (20th century). We are invited to do an examination of conscience. Are we like many of His disciples who said, "This is a hard saying; who can understand it?" (John 6: 60), went back and walked with Him no more (John 6: 66)? Or do we respond as Simon Peter who answered Jesus, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have

Talk Session on "Blessed Virign Mary, Mother of God and Mother of Us All".

This talk focused on Mother Mary as mother of God and mother of the Church in general level.

Being the mother of God, Mother Mary has an intercessory role in our lives and many of us have experienced Mother Mary as a very good intercessor in our prayers.

Mother Mary as mother of God was discussed by the Councils in around 4th century along with the discussion about Jesus Christ who physically is the son of Mother Mary. With the Council's decision that Jesus Christ is God and Men in divine nature and human nature, consequently Mother Mary is the Mother of God. As the Mother of God, Mary has assumed the privilege of mother of the Church.



All roles that we attribute to Mother Mary come from her very close connection with Christ that is why Mother Mary has a special place in our relationship with God. Jesus Christ with HIS divine nature and human nature is the only mediator between God and men. By virtue of Jesus Christ, Mother Mary is the mediator between Jesus Christ and men.



Mother Mary as the mother of Church is described in John 19:22-27 when Jesus, on the cross, said to Mother Mary "Woman, behold thy son" then He said to His disciple "Behold thy mother' and from that moment the disciple took Mother Mary to his home. Mother Mary then became a member of church. In 1960-1965 Vatican Council produced a document called "Lumen Gencio" at which Mother Mary is said as the Mother of Church who served very good examples for us to follow in order to be saved such that as human being we could live in grace and attain salvation. When we live in grace, like Mother Mary, we are able to live in faith, hope and love and being faithful to Jesus Christ.

Jesus Christ procured our salvation by being obedient to God until death to be in the solidarity with men and Mother Mary took park in the mystery of salvation by her obedient to God. When Jesus suffered on the cross, Mother Mary also suffered because of her love to her son. In her suffering she took part in the sacrifice of Jesus Christ. By following the examples of Mother Mary, we learn to sacrifice ourselves and always obey God's will to be saved.



Sacrament of Reconciliation / FHC & Confirmation

This pandemic season has turned everything online, including Mass. Under these circumstances, we have been working within the constraints, both regulatory and practical, to ensure that our "First Holy Communion" and "Sacrament of Confirmation" are initiated physically to our children. Last year, initiation of all these sacraments was kept on hold. We are heartened by our children's love for Jesus and delighted that we were able to celebrate their sacraments of First Holy Communion and Confirmation this year. After a year of living with Covid-related restrictions, we have learned a lot about how to worship and to celebrate special days while following safety precautions.

We have divided our students from our 2019-20 and 2020-21 CCD Programmes into smaller batches for First Holy Communion and Confirmation Masses to keep the number of Church attendees at a safe level. The planning and operation of this was a major effort and we would like to express our gratitude to our Parish Office staff, our Covid Task Force volunteers, our STPCICP volunteers, including ushers and readers, and our CCD Coordinators and volunteers. Also,



to all parents and CCD families for their patience and

cooperation throughout. After successfully completion of many batches of First Holy Communion & Sacrament of Confirmation in May, we continued in June until the alarming increase of COVID-19 cases. We have decided to hold the balance physical Masses and will restart only once the situation improves. Most of the parents appreciated our efforts and here is the testimony from one of the parents:

11th May 2021 was an emotional day for most parents to set foot again at St. Theresia after more than a year. In contrast, the children were all upbeat and excited. After all, it was their first Holy Communion. Expectations were low. Everybody just wanted to get thru the motion and be part of this important event in a Catholic's life. But everybody was in a surprise.

The event proceeded with a near-perfect precision but without lacking the solemnity of the Sacrament. Fr. Moko was in his usual element delivering punchlines during a shortened homily. The parent coordinators, teachers, and church ushers were at their toes to ensure efficient flow of events. And the stars of the show, the children, seemed to be "guided" well.

11th May 2021. It was a day to remember for everyone.




ONLINE COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES IN JUNE 2021

Community Fellowship




CALL TO PRAY TOGETHER AS ONE STPCICP FAMILY

WHERE?

Wherever you are. In the comfort your own place. Even we are apart, our sincere prayer will be lifted at the same time to our LORD GOD

HOW TO?

Each community invite all members/participants to pray and fast at the same time. IF some people are only willing to pray and fast on a specific day, each community can come up with a roster to make sure every day at least one person pray and fast during the period of 40days.

The aim is to have more people pray at the same time at 3:00pm and 9:00pm. And if they want to add more prayers, such us the Rosary, Angelus... and spend some quiet time for reflection, you are encouraged to do so.
