Family Apostolic Ministry's Workshop Series 2026

CURRENT ISSUES & CHALLENGES OF FAMILY

On Saturday, June 20, 2026, the Family Apostolic Ministry (FAM), successfully launched its on-site Workshop Series focusing on "**Current Issues & Challenges of The Family**". Held at St. Theresia Church in Menteng, Jakarta, the inaugural event drew approximately 45 enthusiastic participants. The diverse audience spanned across generational mix—including Gen Z, Millennials, Gen X, and Baby Boomers—comprising individuals, couples, and entire families. While most attendees were from our parish, the event also welcomed members from local parishes drawn to the English-medium session.

Led by the esteemed speaker **Fr. Anton Prasetyo, CICM**, and **Brother Andi** as the moderator, this first session dive deep into "**The Gift and Realities of Marriage and its Challenges and Problems**". Fr. Anton introduced the foundational elements of family life, shedding light on the common catalysts that drive couples to seek pastoral or professional help. The discussion focused on practical strategies to overcome barriers in communication, navigate conflict, address mental health concerns, and ultimately strengthen the foundational relationships within the family.

As an introductory session on marriage and family dynamics, this workshop laid the groundwork for an ongoing journey. To build upon these insights, FAM will soon host Workshop Series 2, which will pivot toward equipping participants with basic skills to help and facilitate others, placing a strong emphasis on the art of active listening. Details and registration for the upcoming series will be published across the parish's primary communication channels, including WhatsApp groups, social media platforms, and announcements during weekend masses.

Key Takeaways from the Session are:

- Marriage is a sacred gift from God, built on love, commitment, trust, and mutual respect.
- Strong marriages are nurtured through open communication, quality time together, and the willingness to forgive.





- Differences and challenges are a natural part of married life and should be approached with understanding, patience, and empathy.
- Couples are called to journey together as companions, supporting one another through life's joys and difficulties.
- A healthy marriage requires continuous effort, prayer, and placing Christ at the centre of family life.

The session concluded with a reminder that while marriage is one of God's greatest gifts, it also requires continuous nurturing, sacrifice, and grace. Participants left with a renewed appreciation that successful marriages are not free from challenges; rather, they are strengthened when couples journey together with love, understanding, forgiveness, and faith in God. The Family Apostolic Ministry hopes that the insights shared by Fr. Anton will inspire couples and families to continue building Christ-centred homes rooted in love and commitment.

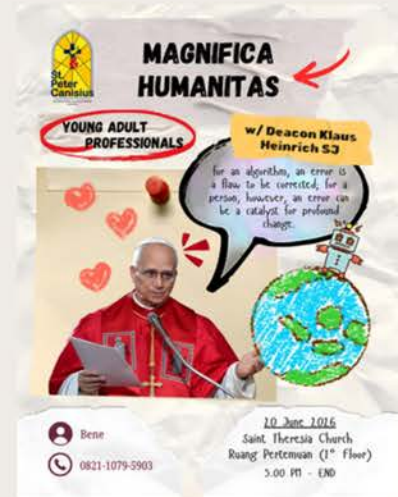
MAGNIFICA HUMANITAS

OUTREACH AT LP4Y

On 13 June 2026, the Young Adult Professionals (YAPpies) ministry held its second session with the youths of LP4Y (Life Project for Youth) in Cilincing, North Jakarta. The volunteer team—**Jacek, Laikah, Dian,** and **Bene**—continued the English learning program from the first meeting, accompanying the youths as they prepare for future employment.

The youths participating in this program come from diverse backgrounds and have faced significant barriers to education. Many were unable to continue to higher education, with some having completed only elementary or junior high school. Through LP4Y, they receive free training and holistic support to develop the skills, confidence, and work readiness needed to secure meaningful employment and build a better future.

The session began with a lively icebreaker led by Laikah through the game "**Would You Rather**", creating a relaxed and engaging atmosphere. This was followed by a presentation on practical interview procedures and useful tips for job interviews in both English and Bahasa Indonesia, highlighting the key dos and don'ts that can help candidates make a positive impression.

To conclude the session, the participants were divided into small groups, each guided by one facilitator. Four youths who are preparing to apply for jobs after completing their training at LP4Y participated in mock interviews in Bahasa Indonesia, where they



received constructive feedback and encouragement. Through these activities, the volunteers hope to empower the youths with greater confidence, practical communication skills, and readiness to enter the workforce.

The Young Adult Professionals ministry is conducting this three-month outreach program from **June to August 2026**, with sessions held **twice a month on Saturdays, from 1:00–3:00 p.m.** in Cilincing, North Jakarta.

We warmly invite parishioners who would like to share their time and talents by volunteering in this meaningful outreach. Together, we can accompany these young people as they discover new opportunities and build hope for the future.

STAPLE FOOD DISTRIBUTION FOR REFUGEES

In collaboration with **Lembaga Daya Dharma (LDD)** of the Archdiocese of Jakarta and the **Jesuit Refugee Service (JRS)**, the Expat Parish takes part in a monthly staple food distribution program for refugees residing in Jakarta. Parish volunteers serve primarily as greeters and hosts, welcoming refugee families and accompanying them throughout the distribution process. All food supplies are generously provided through donations coordinated by LDD and its benefactors.

The refugee families served through this program come predominantly from **Somalia, Yemen, Afghanistan, and Iran**. During the most recent distribution, 73 families were invited, of whom 58 families were able to attend.

In addition, once or twice each year, the Expat Parish organizes donation drives through which parishioners contribute gently used items in good condition, including clothing, household utensils, bed linens, and other essential necessities. Refugee families are invited to select and take the items they need, providing not only practical assistance but also affirming their dignity and fostering a sense of care, welcome, and community.

When we first came to Jakarta in 2013, we were not very sure how we would be welcomed or how our journey in a new country would unfold. But God had His own plan for us. We were truly fortunate to become part of St. Peter Canisius International Catholic Parish, and from there began a beautiful journey of faith, service and fellowship.

STPCICP was never just a parish community for us. It became our second home. It was in this parish that our two boys received their sacrament of First Holy Communion and Confirmation. Later, they also had the joy of serving as altar servers. Our elder son, **Jarvis**, was also blessed to become one of the youngest lectors, and he truly enjoyed serving as a lector, even when he returned to Jakarta during his holidays.

As a family, we always believed that God has given each of us certain talents. We could have easily kept ourselves busy with our own lives and not given much time to the Lord. But then we asked ourselves, what is the use of having beautiful talents if we do not use them for God and His people? So, as one Goveas family, we decided to dedicate our time and talents to the Lord.

Our ministry journey started in 2016 when we became CCD volunteer teachers. From there, the Lord slowly opened many doors for us to serve in different ways. Over the years, we were blessed to serve as **CCD teachers, Parish Council member, Mass Coordinator (MC), YF helpers** and active parish volunteers in whatever events or initiatives. We were also happy to take personal part in initiatives such as **“Joy of Giving,”** supporting refugees and orphanages, and many other parish activities.

Later, we were given the opportunity to serve as the editors of the parish bulletin, a ministry that has remained very close to my heart. Through the bulletin, we were able to capture the life of the parish, share reflections, highlight ministries and bring together the many beautiful stories of our community.

Jyoti also became more active in parish life through her service as a **lector**, **Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion** and by helping the parish whenever support was required. Together, we also became actively involved in the **Family Apostolic Ministry**, especially in helping young couples prepare for the Sacrament of Marriage.

For us, every ministry, every event and every initiative was not just a responsibility. **It was a blessing.** We always felt that the more time we spent with the parish community, the more joy, peace and meaning we received in return.

As we now prepare to move out of this lovely parish, what touches our hearts the most is that while we came closer to God through our service, we also made some beautiful friends for life. We do not know whether we will ever again find such a loving, caring and faith-filled community like STPCICP.

One of the most touching moments for us was on **30 May 2026**, during the Saturday 3:30 PM Mass, when we were felicitated and thanked by the parish. The kind and sweet words of **Fr. Agung** will always remain close to our hearts. This was followed by a very heart-touching farewell gathering, where more than 70 parishioners came together to wish us good luck and send us off with love and blessings.

As we look back, our hearts are filled with gratitude. We thank our parish priests, Parish Council members, ministry coordinators, CCD team, FAM members, lectors, choir members, altar servers, volunteers and all parishioners who have been part of our journey.

This is not goodbye. This is only a new beginning. Wherever we go, STPCICP will always remain part of our faith journey and our family story. Please continue to keep us in your prayers, as we too will continue to pray for STPCICP and all its beautiful ministries.

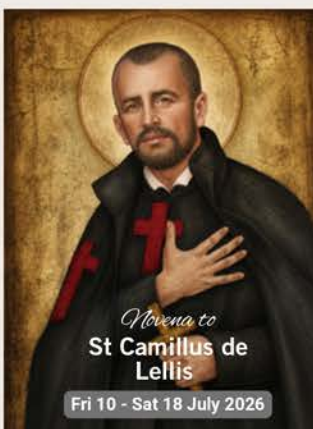
ONLINE PRAYER

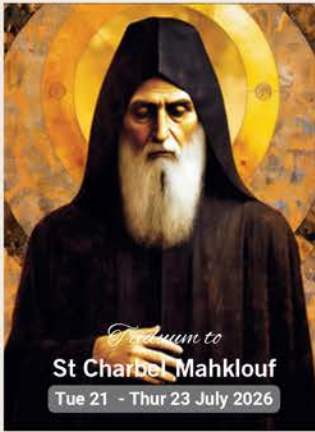
We warmly invite all parishioners and their families to join our 9:00 PM online prayer and experience the peace and blessings of praying together as one faith community.



St. Veronica Giuliani was an ordinary woman with an extraordinary love for Jesus. Born in Italy in 1660, she chose a life devoted entirely to God as a Capuchin Poor Clare nun. Though she faced illness, misunderstandings, and many spiritual trials, she remained faithful, offering her prayers and sufferings for others. Known for her humility, kindness, and deep union with Christ, Veronica showed that true holiness is not found in extraordinary achievements, but in loving God faithfully through the ordinary moments of life. As she beautifully said, **"Love is the center of all the commandments."**



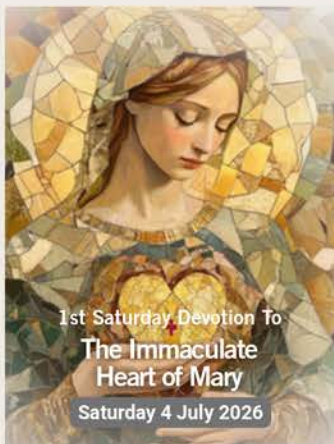
St. Camillus de Lellis was a former soldier whose life was transformed by God's mercy. After years of struggle and personal failures, he discovered his true calling while caring for the sick and forgotten. He became a priest and dedicated his life to serving those who suffered, teaching that the sick need not only medicine but also compassion. Remembered as the patron saint of hospitals, nurses, and the sick, St. Camillus reminds us that God can turn our deepest wounds into a mission of love. His life echoes one powerful message: **our scars can become a source of healing for others.**



St. Charbel Makhlouf was a humble Lebanese monk who devoted his life to silence, prayer, and union with God. While the world often values success and recognition, Charbel chose a hidden life of simplicity and faithfulness. After his death, countless people reported receiving graces, healings, and miracles through his intercession. Today, he is remembered as a saint who found extraordinary holiness in an ordinary, quiet life. His story reminds us that **in a noisy world, a heart close to God can become a light for many.**



St. Alphonsus Liguori was a brilliant lawyer who gave up a successful career to follow God's call. Becoming a priest, he dedicated his life to preaching God's mercy, especially to the poor and those who felt far from Him. Through his writings, prayers, and compassionate ministry, he helped countless people discover a loving and forgiving God. Named a Doctor of the Church, St. Alphonsus reminds us that **true success is not found in worldly achievements, but in loving God and trusting in His mercy.**

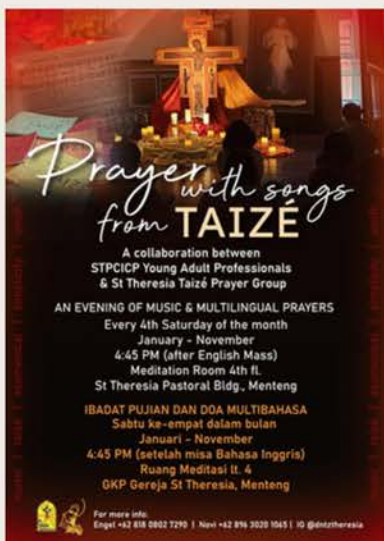

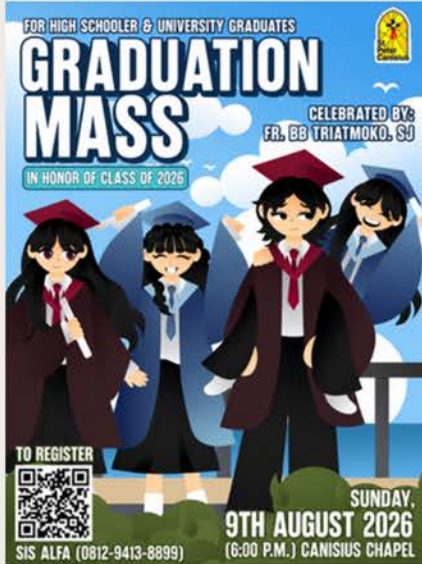
