FREEDOM FROM SLAVERY AND TORTURE

"No one shall be held in slavery or servitude... No one shall be subjected to torture or to cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment" (Universal Declaration of Human Rights, Articles 4 and 5)

Beloved Sisters and Brothers,

We are all familiar with the biblical commandment to love God and our neighbor. This commandment, Jesus says, sums up all religious laws and obligations and thus is the greatest. Living out such commandment is undoubtedly challenging for many of us. It is especially difficult because it calls us to actively love God and every human being, while we often do not experience such love. We need to realize, however, that loving God and our neighbor also consists in not doing anything contrary to such love. If we cannot love them, at least we do not harm them. One basic principle of Natural Law puts these two elements together: "Do good and avoid evil." While it remains our ideal to do good to others, it is no less important not to inflict harm on them.





The prohibition of holding anyone in slavery or torturing them must be placed in the context of loving one's neighbour by not harming them. Indeed, loving one's neighbor is a religious terminology and therefore, we often use a more universal language of respecting human rights or promoting human dignity. As we have previously learnt, the idea of human rights stems from the understanding and realization that all human beings are equal and therefore, entitled to various rights such

as those to life and liberty, without discrimination. These rights need to

be upheld so that human beings may live freely to the fullest in accordance with their dignity. Slavery and torture precisely prevent them from attaining their life potential as they are being subjected to degrading treatment.

Slavery may take different forms, not only in the ownership of other people as properties as in slave trade, but also in the relationship of dominance and submission. It fundamentally puts people in the situation



that is not conducive for proper human growth. Slavery often involves forced labor or other services that do not allow people to engage in free and fair working agreement. It is no coincidence that torture is

inextricably linked to slavery. When people are considered slaves in the broad sense of the word, they are usually treated simply as properties that are subject to their owner's whim, including through torture. Torture is often considered necessary to maintain slavery as the owner often attempts to break the soul of the slaves. This is why slavery and torture dehumanize.

Slavery is certainly not a thing of the past as many people, especially the poor, still find themselves in the



manifestation of our faith.

conditions of forced labor. Torture, both physical and mental, is even more prevalent as it may happen quietly behind a façade of family togetherness or smiling appearance. Torture is always degrading us as human beings. Its use manifests our unbridled will to get what we want and complete disregard for human dignity. When we value our wants, whatever they may be, more than the intrinsic worth of every human being, we choose ourselves over God who has created every one of us. Here we fail to love our neighbor as ourselves. This is why we need to continue to uphold and promote the slavery and torture ban as a


Topic: Young and Committed 2 "The Power of

25th Virtual Faith Forum



Topic: Socialization on the Protocol of Protection for Children and Vulnerable Adults (PPADR)

On 15th October 2022, St. Peter Canisius International Catholic Parish held its first socialization for the *Protocol of Protection for Children and Vulnerable Adults (Protokol Perlindungan Anak dan Dewasa Rentan-shortened as PPADR).* The socialization was presented by Mr. Iskandar Leman, the main facilitator of PPADR in Theresia parish. All the definition of PPADR and what this protocol against was well addressed, and mostly understood by 30 parishioners that joined. This socialization was initiated in recognizing the necessity of providing a safe space for children and adults in the Church as introduced by KAJ.

Protocol of Protection for Children and Vulnerable Adults is derived from the Pope Francis' document called

Vox Estis Lux Mundi. Pope Francis has put a big concern towards the sexual violence occurred in the church, done by clerics. He then instructs the churches all over the world to take a serious note about the cases and, to set up a team to take care of the victims. This protocol is focusing on the victims' recovery, and to make sure that church is a safe place for victims and a place for people to seek help and protection.



In the end of the socialization, the parishioners are requested to join the response team for St. Peter Canisius International Catholic Parish. There are 2 main teams for the protocol, those are service team and




professional team. Later, the service team is divided into 2, those handling of the **complaint handling** and **service team**. In the professional team, the parish will need medics, psychologist, lawyers, and other professional that could support the recovery of the victims.

Eternal rest grant unto them, Oh! Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Love always, in the name of Jesus. Amen




CCD CORNER

Feast of St. Jude

St. Jude's Feast Day is celebrated on October 28th and to celebrate his feast, STPCICP conducted 09 days online novena to be prayed together as one Parish

St. Jude was one of the Apostles and a cousin of Jesus. In the Roman Catholic Church, he is the patron saint of desperate cases and lost causes. Saint Jude's attribute is a club. He is also often shown in icons with a flame around his head. This represents his presence at Pentecost when he received the Holy Spirit with the other apostles. The nine days of novena prayer signify the nine days the twelve Apostles prayed together between Jesus' Ascension and Pentecost, when they were filled with the presence of the Holy Spirit. Aside from being the patron saint of lost causes, St. Jude is a symbol of choosing faith when all seems lost. He is a testament to standing firm in religious truth in the face of an ever uncertain and challenging world. St. Jude Pray for us

Novena for the Holy Souls in Purgatory and Prayer to St. Gertrude (Oct 25 to Nov 02)

According to tradition, Our Lord told St. Gertrude the Great that each time she piously recited the following prayer, it would greatly ease the suffering of those holy souls in purgatory: "Eternal Father, I offer Thee the Most Precious Blood of Thy Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the masses said throughout the world today, for all the holy souls in purgatory, for sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal church, those in my own home and within my family.
