ANXIETY DISORDER

Beloved Sisters and Brothers,

We all experience anxiety. For example, speaking in front of a group or driving in heavy traffic or waiting to see a doctor can make us anxious. However, when feelings of intense fear and distress become overwhelming and prevent us from doing everyday activities, an anxiety disorder may be the cause. Anxiety and anxiety disorders range from mild interference to major difficulties in life.

This experience of intense anxiety reminds me of two incidents. Many years ago, I was travelling by plane from Port Moresby, Papua New Guinea, to Singapore. The time the plane was heading to the runway, ready to take off, suddenly there was a commotion in the plane. The stewardess and the co-pilot stepped in and talked with a Korean passenger, who was speaking so loudly in his language. With a help of another passenger who could understand his language it became clear that the passenger suddenly decided to spend more time in the city and he demanded to get off the plane, though his boarding pass was right. The pilot decided to grant his request and so the plane turned around heading back to the gate, only to get



him off, and without security check whatsoever the plane returned to the runway and took off. During this trip I could not sleep; I was filled with intense anxiety worrying about the possible threats. Also, I once on my trip by plane from Jakarta to Manado and while still in the air the plane lost cabin pressure and was getting hot without air conditioning any longer, the passenger oxygen masks deployed automatically and every one was required to put the mask on to help breath. There was a big commotion and screaming inside the plane; all passengers were gripped by a deep feeling of anxiety. Myself, aware of the possible accident that could take my life I murmured the prayer of contrition! Fortunately,



the oxygen system was restored and the plane could touch down safely.

According to the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI), a United States-based nonprofit organization, over 40 million adults in the U.S. (19.1%) have an anxiety disorder. Meanwhile, approximately 7% of children aged 3-17 experience issues with anxiety each year. Most people develop symptoms before age 21 (<https://www.nami.org/About-Mental-Illness/Mental-Health-Conditions/Anxiety-Disorders>). According to Mayo Clinic among the symptoms or signs of anxiety disorder are: feeling nervous, restless or tense; having an increased heart rate; breathing rapidly (hyperventilation); sweating; trembling; feeling weak or tired;

having trouble sleeping; having difficulty controlling worry, etc. The clinic offers two main treatments for anxiety disorders which are psycho-therapy and medications (<https://www.mayoclinic.org/diseases-conditions/anxiety/symptoms-causes/syc-20350961>).

Pope Francis identifies that the worries and fears can obstruct our best judgment and right intentions. Anxiety clouds our judgment and perceptions and can prevent us from taking right steps and decisions. Anxiety can prevent us from moving forward. In the post synodal apostolic exhortation *Christus Vivit* (2019),

addressed particularly to the youth, he advises: *"Keep following your hopes and dreams. But be careful about one temptation that can hold us back. It is anxiety. Anxiety can work against us by making us give up whenever we do not see instant results. Our best dreams are only attained through hope, patience and commitment, and not in haste. At the same time, we should not be hesitant, afraid to take chances or make mistakes. Avoid the paralysis of the living dead, who have no life because they are afraid to take risks, to make mistakes or to persevere in their*

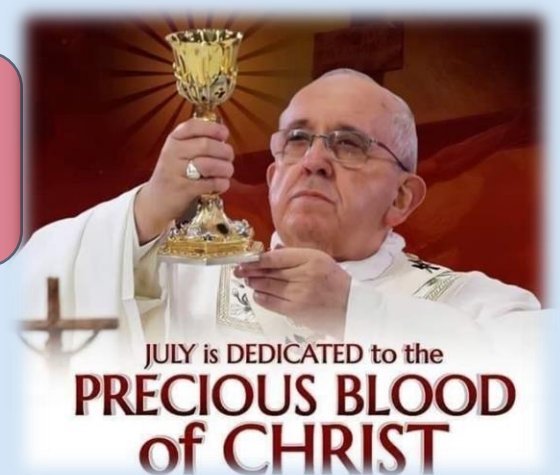
commitments. Even if you make mistakes, you can always get up and start over, for no one has the right to rob you of hope" (no. 142).

Anxiety is a difficult and challenging issue. Although it is not a sin and is not a punishment for sin, but rather it comes from our imperfect human nature, anxiety can affect our life negatively. In the same document Pope Francis encourages us: ***"Take risks, even if it means making mistakes. Don't go through life anesthetized or approach the world like tourists. Make a ruckus! Cast out the fears that paralyze you, so that you don't become young mummies. Live! Give yourselves over to the best of life!"*** (no. 143).

July Month -Precious Blood of Jesus Christ

One devotion in the Catholic Church connected to the Passion of Jesus Christ is the honouring of his Precious Blood. It is a recognition of Jesus' sacrifice and how he spilled his blood for the salvation of humanity. Furthermore, this blood is made present through the gift of the Eucharist and is something we can consume at Mass, along with the body of Christ, under the appearance of bread and wine. Over time the Church developed various feasts of the Precious Blood, but it wasn't until the 19th century when a universal feast was established. During the First Italian War for Independence in 1849, Pope Pius IX went into exile to Gaeta. He went there with Don Giovanni Merlini, third superior general of the Fathers of the Most Precious Blood. While the war was still raging, Merlini suggested to Pope Pius IX that he create a universal feast to the Precious Blood to beg God's heavenly aid to end the war and bring peace to Rome. Pius IX subsequently made a statement on June 30, 1849 that he intended to create a feast in honour of the Precious Blood. The war soon ended, and he



returned to Rome shortly thereafter. On August 10, he made it official and proclaimed that the 1st Sunday in July will be dedicated to the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ. Later, Pope Pius X assigned July 1 as the fixed date of this celebration. After Vatican II the feast was removed from the calendar, but a votive Mass in honour of the Precious Blood was established and can be celebrated in the month of July (as well as most other months of the year). For these reasons the entire month of July is traditionally dedicated to the Precious Blood, and Catholics are encouraged to meditate on the profound sacrifice of Jesus and the pouring out of his blood for humanity.

Let's all pray the Prayer to The Precious Blood during the entire month of July to ask whatever we need:
ETERNAL FATHER, I OFFER THEE THE PRECIOUS BLOOD OF JESUS CHRIST, THE MERITS, LOVE AND SUFFERINGS OF HIS SACRED HEART, THE TEARS AND SORROWS OF OUR IMMACULATE MOTHER, AS THE PRICE OF THE FAVOR I WISH TO OBTAIN, IF IT IS FOR THY GLORY AND MY SALVATION. Amen.

Reflection #1 – By Nina

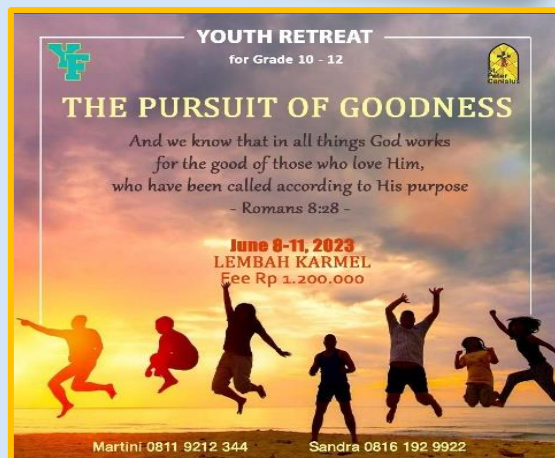

The Youth Fellowship gathered at Ceria Montessori and headed to Lembah Karmel, a retreat center located in Puncak, Bogor. Although the long travel hours delayed the schedule, it was an opportunity for the participants to establish and strengthen friendships.

Friday and Saturday emerged as the heart and soul of The Pursuit of Goodness Retreat began. Guided by devout sisters and

brothers in Christ, the Youth Fellowship delved deep into God's love for each and every one of us. Each session was unique to nurture our inner healing and create an everlasting foundation with our Lord Almighty. The group explored session topics such as “You are Loved”, “Jesus the Savior”, “Inner Healing”, “Forgiveness as the Key of Healing”, and “Growth”.

Prior to the sessions, the service team warmed our hearts and minds through praise and worship, some even with dancing. Naturally, there were some breaks to calm and soothe our thoughts, as if the tranquil environment hadn't already accomplished that.





While the outbound activities and nightly card games undeniably brought joy and laughter, it was the religious rituals led by the devout nuns and priests that truly touched our souls. Everyone in the community can attest that they experienced extraordinary ways to be in the presence of God. Some even showed how their lives were changed drastically. There was this one person who became a lot more social and joyful after the retreat which really showed the effects of the retreat.

From my personal viewpoint of this retreat, I really can say that I have strengthened my bonds with God, the Holy Spirit, and Lord Jesus. A lot of us have learned to forgive and to heal our inner wounds, but to me it wasn't that much of an effect, because I've already found peace before pursuing the retreat. During the retreat I witnessed many were in the state of healing and experiencing inner peace. Some even to the extent where they cried out, not in sadness, but in gratefulness and joyfulness. They have been found by God.

This retreat really was refreshing for me because I was in constant communication with God. I just finished all my exams, so this really refreshed my mind from Jakarta and my busy life.

Lembah Karmel was one of the most interesting places I've been to. The people there were very hospitable and very welcoming. Built by many nuns and priests, Lembah Karmel is a great place to hold retreats because of its full facilities, residents, architecture, and environment.

If I had the chance to return, I surely would return. Kudos to the organizers.

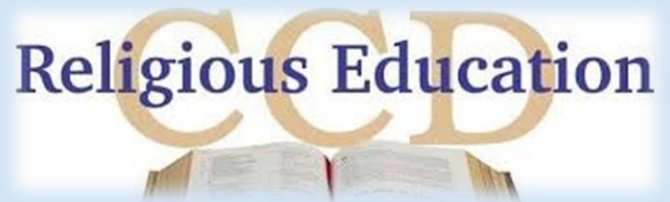

Our mission is to help you as parents/guardians nurture and foster growth in the Catholic faith of your children. This is accomplished with help from Catechists/CCD volunteers of our Parish who give their time and talents.



Registration for CCD classes will commence in August and classes will start on Saturday, 2 September 23, physical class at Bellarminus School 1.00pm – 2.30pm. Students will proceed to join our Saturday 3.30pm Mass at St. Theresia Church after class. In the case of Confirmation students, there will be monthly Youth Mass at Canisius Chapel, Sunday 6pm (schedule will be advised in advance).

Registration will be online, via our Parish Online Confirmation Registration Form (for Confirmation Mass in May 2024), or our Parish Online FHC Registration Form (for FHC Mass in Apr 2024) and submitted to our Parish Office.

Parents should complete and submit their registration by 31 August 23 (last date for online submission). Physical classes will commence on 02 September 2023 at Bellarminus School, details will be advised in advance. *[FHC is a 2-year program at our Parish - if you are entering your 2nd year of FHC, please consult your CCD group coordinator directly (you do not need to re-register)]*

When you register, you will be asked to upload a copy of your child's Baptismal Certificate. You must forward a copy of your online registration submission to your CCD group coordinator, together with soft copy of your child's Baptismal Certificate. Please ask your CCD group coordinator about payment of registration fee and CCD book.

Family Apostolic Ministry (FAM)

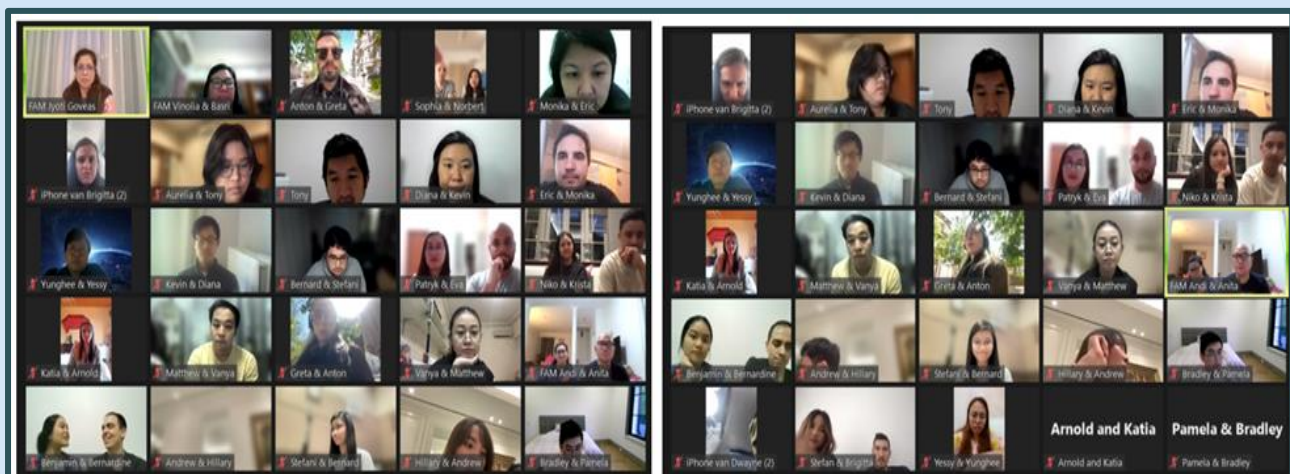


Marriage Preparation Course (MPC): All dioceses require couples to undergo courses for marriage preparation. Holy Matrimony is a life-long commitment and a Sacrament. Because it is a Sacrament, it actual confers God's grace on those who are married. For that reason and because it is irrevocable, Catholic couples must be prepared before entering into a marital union. These classes are often called pre-cana classes.

Marriage Preparation Course (MPC) is a program to prepare couples for marriage in the Catholic Church and for reaching wholeness in their marriage life.

The MPC is run by the Family Apostolic Ministry (FAM) consist of many married couples who have strong love for good marriages and family life and have been professionally trained to conduct the MPC.

Since May 2022, FAM has conducted 5 batches of MPC with a total attendance of 56 couples. The last batch of MPC was conducted on 19, 20, 26, 27th May 2023 and, was attended by 17 couples from various nationalities.



The MPC topics focus on marriage is a path to wholeness/fullness. The union of man and woman in marriage involves the union of total personhood: physical, emotional, psychological and spiritual dimensions. It enables each other experiencing fullness of love and life and growing towards wholeness. I become a better person because of you, you become a better person because of me and together we reach wholeness.

On that purpose, the flow of MPC topics begins with the Participants to explore the self they bring to the marriage. This is the "I" component which covers topics on Self Esteem and Maturity to Marriage.

Then succeeding topics focus on the dynamics of the couple relationship, the "We", how we communicate, how we share roles, how we grow our intimacy, etc.

The peak of the MPC is a one on one discussion of a couple facilitated by a trained facilitator on Marriage Expectation Inventory.

Parish Volunteers Fellowship



Fellowship is the relationship that we have with one another as Christians. It is based on the relationship we have with Jesus Christ. When you and I became Christians three relationships changed: Jesus became our Savior; God became our Father; and the church became our family. In other words, believers are now my brothers and sisters in Christ and accepted into the family of God.

God has given us special talents and gifts that we use to support our parish as volunteers and by serving our parish we do the will of God.

As a tradition of our parish, every year we organize fellowship get togethers to our various volunteer communities. In the month of April, we organized fellowship dinner for Ushers, Lectors and Eucharistic Ministers (EMHC) and in May month, fellowship dinner was organized for CCD Teachers, Coordinators, Volunteers & Marriage Preparation Facilitators.

Last month in June, all the choir members from different choir groups were invited to join the fellowship dinner at JJ Royal Brasserie, Lotte Shopping Avenue. During this dinner for all the different choir groups, ***"Certificate of Appreciation"*** was handed over in recognition of their continued service to our parish.

We thank all our volunteers for their continuous tireless support for the parish; without them it is not possible for us to have such a wonderful parish community.





Alter Server Ministry Initiative



Apart from serving on the Altar, altar servers are also to serve the community. Praise the Lord, we were given a blessed opportunity to visit Rumah Harapan, share our blessing, time, and learn the struggles for parents and children fighting different diseases.

On Sunday, 11th of June 2023, Altar Servers paid a visit from 10 in the morning to 1:30 in the afternoon to Rumah Harapan Valencia Care Foundation, where a group of dedicated volunteers raise children with cancer or special needs. We've managed to raise more than 3 million rupiah in donations, which was used to buy picture books, Legos/toys, cooking oil, milk, sugar, toilet paper, snacks among other essentials. Given their very young ages we didn't always have much to converse about with them, nor play any actual games, yet eventually we got along with them and shared many laughs while still empathising with their conditions as informed by their caretakers.



Indeed some people were notably close/ 'glued' to the super energetic children, like parents on a chaotic day (shoutout to Patricia and Winston!) This event was initiated by Sis Melissa & Ibu Valencia; the latter shared her own experience being a mother of an autistic child who couldn't speak even at 15 years of age, until one blessed day where he finally said 'Mom you look beautiful,' though, weirdly still, struggles to speak Bahasa despite it being used more often in their home.

This organisation's motto is **"There is Always Hope for Everything"**, and truly I was reminded that every child is a gift from God, no matter how disadvantaged or unmanageable they may be. This visit was coincidentally on the Feast of Corpus Christi, wherein we reaffirm Jesus' real presence in the Eucharist, so it follows that we too should be present and reach out to the less fortunate. As though we wind back down to Ordinary Time, the spirit of selflessness in spending time with these kids, praying for them, and supporting them is to be our attitude all year round.

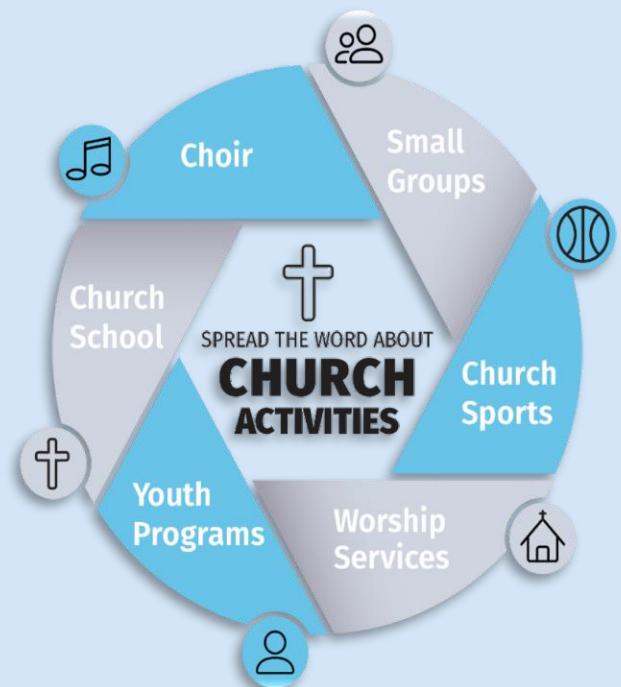

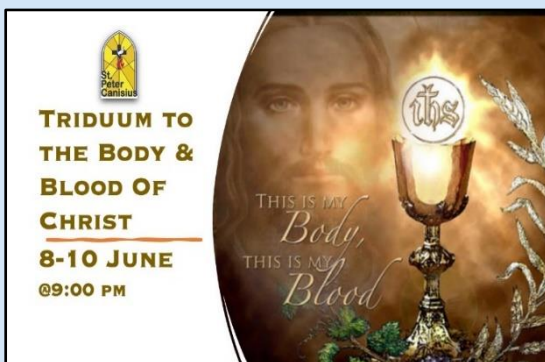
Triduum to Holy Trinity

Novena to Our Lady of Perpetual Help

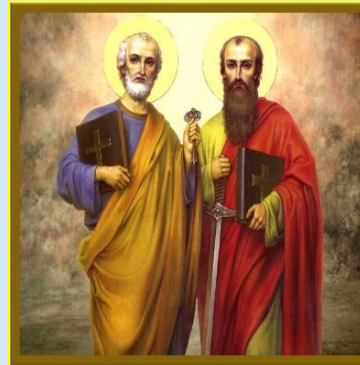

Triduum to St. Paul & St. Peter the Apostles

St Peter, a bold follower of Christ, who carefully listened and obeyed, sometimes failed in 'perfect' faith. St Paul went from persecuting Christians to dedicating his life to proclaiming God's Word.

Both these apostles, despite their flaws and past failures, went on to proclaim the Gospel, leaving us with a priceless legacy of faith and witness.

Our mistakes are part of us, but we do not have to let them define us.


