#### CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING ON COMMON GOOD

#### Beloved Sisters and Brothers,

What is the Common Good? In theological terms the common good is defined in Pope John XXIII's encyclical *Mater et Magistra* and Vatican II as "the sum total of social conditions which allow people, either as groups or as individuals, to reach their fulfilment more fully and more easily."


Social life is a lot like being on a sports team. Individual players want to be as successful as possible, perhaps by scoring lots of points. The ultimate goal of each player, however, is the success of the team, a goal more than the sum of every player's statistic. A team does not win because each player tries to score as many points as possible, but conditions do need to be optimal for each individual player to play well in order for a team to win. The good of both the individual and the team are interdependent. The common good is a lot like the set of "entimal conditions" that allow both the team and its players to say



of "optimal conditions" that allow both the team and its players to succeed.

The common good in Catholic social teaching "consists of three essential elements"

• "Respect for the person, as such"- The Church goes on to cite the obligation for public authorities to respect fundamental and inalienable rights. This means far more than the utilitarian "greatest good for the greatest number," but insists that majorities respect individual rights.



- The "social well-being and development of the group"- The Church goes on to call 'development' the embodiment of all social duties and insists public authorities "arbitrate...between various particular interests" to attain it. Essential to this is ensuring the accessibility to each person of "what is needed to lead a truly human life: food, clothing, health, work, education and culture, suitable information, the right to establish a family, and so on."
- **Peace** The Church notes the proper responsibility of public authorities to ensure the security of society, through morally acceptable means

Who is responsible to carry out the common good? First of all, everyone has responsibility for the common good as an embodiment of charity and justice. In Pope Benedict's words, "The more we strive to secure a common

good corresponding to the real needs of our neighbours, the more effectively we love them. Every Christian is called to practice this charity, in a manner corresponding to his vocation and according to the degree of influence he wields in the pólis."

The state shares responsibility for the common good since "the common good is the reason that the political authority exists." The State must ensure the coherency, unity, and organization of civil society "in order that the common good may be attained with the contribution of every citizen.

As we study and reflect on the theme of Common Good this year, together as a community we work in creative ways to improve the wellbeing of people in our society and the wider world.

Fr. Francis Teo, MCSPA who celebrated the Mass asked the youth to bear testimony of Jesus as done by John the Baptist.

Jesus is the Lamb of God - the sacrificial lamb who follows the will of God the Father. Father Francis described a lamb, as an animal who is very meek and docile. When it is about to be slaughtered there is little resistance or none at all, the lamb just waits quietly. Like a lamb who is meek and docile, Jesus followed whatever it was that was pleasing to God the Father even death on the cross, crucified for the salvation of mankind. For the Jews an unblemished lamb is the sacrifice of choice, so when John the Baptist said Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world, he is referring to Jesus as the one who will be sacrificed. John

stands as a witness of this divine truth.

The Role of Youth in Today's Church is very important and Pope Francis in multiple times has encouraged and invited the youth to serve the Lord. Serving young people cannot only prepare them to become future leaders, but also allows them to contribute to the church. This is seen many times in the Bible, as God often used young people to do great things.






With the vision of childlike gestures of our children bringing up their gifts for baby Jesus at the crib, Joy of Giving (JOG) is our parish annual charity drive around Christmas time where we invite our parishioners to donate gifts to be distributed to selected institution or groups. Our last JOG in December 2022 managed to



gather good amount of various donation items such stapple food packages (sembako), snacks for over 200 goodie bags, baby diapers, powdered & UHT milk, school stationery supplies, toys, sanitary supplies. They were distributed to 8 (eight) groups; namely Kelompok Anak Belajar Cakung — education & learning center in slum area, Sanggar Anak Akar & Sanggar Anak Harapan — both are street children shelters, Rumah Prolife & Yayasan Sinar Kasih - these two


give home to underprivileged persons including children, disabled people, African refugees community

#### SEASON OF LENT - OUR JOURNEY

We are approaching Lent, as we welcome Ash Wednesday on February 22nd this year, especially for Catholics, Lent is the awaited time of 40 days to humble ourselves, look back on how we have probably faltered in our spiritual life and how our relationship with the Lord stands once again. Through fasting, abstinence and



almsgiving, we are directed to ask how much can we sacrifice for others? How much have we given to the Lord? Be it time, energy, or any type of self-giving.

Lent or in Bahasa Indonesia called Prapaskah, is a very special and solemn moment to reflect on Jesus' journey while He was in the world. How He fought the evil temptations, how He gave us teachings of life, suffering, betrayal, how to face betrayal, heart breaks and how to love till the end, love untiringly. The Catholic faith gives us quite easy directions during Lent, namely Fasting (eating one full meal a day), Abstinence (doing less of something we indulge in i.e., not eating meat on Fridays, not having sweets for 40 days) and Almsgiving (an act of charity to help those who are in need). Yet during these 40 days we can do more. We can be creative in what we give up for Lent, go beyond the rules to show how much we can do to help others. Matthew 25: 40 "Whatsoever you do to the least of my brothers, that You do unto Me" reminds as that when we extend a helping hand to those who are suffering, those who are in need, The Lord is much aware of this and is pleased.

Brothers and sister in Christ, let us not be afraid to help even if it reaches our own discomfort. Focus on why we are doing these acts and rely on the Lord's providence. These small acts should not be met with regret but with great joy as we better understand the incredible sacrifice that Jesus Christ made for humanity. Feed the hungry, visit the sick, call up the lonely, hug our loved ones, spend a little more time in prayer regularly, refrain from being sarcastic, choose love over anger in any situation.

Through fasting, we feel what it means to be hungry and thirsty. Through abstinence, we are taught that we don't always get what we want when we want it. All these are experienced by those who are less fortunate than we are. These 40 days should be welcomed with great enthusiasm as we journey together with Christ and our fellow men, as we humble ourselves before the Holy One and seek His mercy to open our hearts. On Ash Wednesday, the ash marked on our forehead reminds us how little we really are, "Remember men you are of dust and to dust you shall return". May we always be reminder that we are all the same in the eyes of the Lord, all loved, all cherished, all HIS.

Dear bro/sis in Christ, we ought to be grateful for forty-day liturgical season of special prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at Easter Sunday. As we enter our Lenten journey, may we be brought closer to Christ which will leave us changed by our encounter with Him. Amen!

Such is the promise of the "Infant of Prague." This promise has been kept over and over again yielding countless fruits over the centuries in every country of the Earth.


Triduum online prayer was prayed for seeking the blessings from The Infant of Prague.
